



One morning when Gregor Samsa woke from troubled dreams he found himself transformed in his bed into a horrible vermin. He lay on his armourlike back and if he lifted his head a little he could see his brown belly slightly domed and divided by arches into stiff sections. The bedding was hardly able to cover it and seemed ready to slide off any moment. His many legs pitifully thin compared with the size of the rest of him waved about helplessly as he looked

Whats happened to me he thought It wasnt a dream His room a proper human room although a little too small lay peacefully between its four familiar walls A collection of textile samples lay spread out on the table Samsa was a travelling salesman and above it there hung a picture that he had recently cut out of an illustrated magazine and housed in a nice gilded frame It showed a lady fitted out with a fur hat and fur boa who sat upright raising a heavy fur muff that covered the whole of her lower arm towards the viewer

Gregor then turned to look out the window at the dull weather Drops of rain could be heard hitting the pane which made him feel quite sad How about if I sleep a little bit longer and forget all this nonsense he thought but that was something he was unable to do because he was used to sleeping on his right and in his present state couldnt get into that position However hard he threw himself onto his right he always rolled back to where he was He must have tried it a hundred times shut his eyes so that he wouldnt have to look at the floundering legs and only stopped when he began to feel a mild dull pain there that he had never felt before

Oh God he thought what a strenuous career it is that Ive chosen Travelling day in and day out Doing business like this takes much more effort than doing your own business at home and on top of that theres the curse of travelling worries about making train connections bad and irregular food contact with different people all the time so that you can never get to know anyone or become friendly with them It can all go to Hell He felt a slight itch up on his belly pushed himself slowly up on his back towards the headboard so that he could lift his head better found where the itch was and saw that it was covered with lots of little white spots which he didnt know what to make of and when he tried to feel the place with one of his legs he drew it quickly back because as soon as he touched it he was overcome by a cold shudder

He slid back into his former position Getting up early all the

time he thought it makes you stupid Youve got to get enough sleep Other travelling salesmen live a life of luxury For instance whenever I go back to the guest house during the morning to copy out the contract these gentlemen are always still sitting there eating their breakfasts I ought to just try that with my boss Id get kicked out on the spot But who knows maybe that would be the best thing for me If I didnt have my parents to think about Id have given in my notice a long time ago Id have gone up to the boss and told him just what I think tell him everything I would let him know just what I feel Hed fall right off his desk And its a funny sort of business to be sitting up there at your desk talking down at your subordinates from up there especially when you have to go right up close because the boss is hard of hearing Well theres still some hope once Ive got the money together to pay off my parents debt to him another five or six years I suppose thats definitely what Ill do Thats when Ill make the big change First of all though Ive got to get up my train leaves at five

And he looked over at the alarm clock ticking on the chest of drawers God in Heaven he thought It was half past six and the hands were quietly moving forwards it was even later than half past more like quarter to seven Had the alarm clock not rung He could see from the bed that it had been set for four oclock as it should have been it certainly must have rung Yes but was it possible to quietly sleep through that furniturerattling noise True he had not slept peacefully but probably all the more deeply because of that What should he do now The next train went at seven if he were to catch that he would have to rush like mad and the collection of samples was still not packed and he did not at all feel particularly fresh and lively And even if he did catch the train he would not avoid his bosss anger as the office assistant would have been there to see the five oclock train go he would have put in his report about Gregors not being there a long time ago The office assistant was the bosss man spineless and with no understanding What about if he reported sick But that would be extremely strained and suspicious as in fifteen years of service Gregor had never once yet been ill His boss would certainly come round with the doctor from the medical insurance company accuse his parents of having a lazy son and accept the doctors recommendation not to make any claim as the doctor believed that noone was ever ill but that many were workshy And whats more would he have been entirely wrong in this case Gregor did in fact apart from excessive sleepiness after sleeping for so long feel completely well and even felt much hungrier than usual

He was still hurriedly thinking all this through unable to decide to get out of the bed when the clock struck quarter to seven There was a cautious knock at the door near his head Gregor somebody called it was his mother its quarter to seven Didnt you want to go somewhere That gentle voice Gregor was shocked when he heard his own voice answering it could hardly be recognised as the voice he had had before As if from deep inside him there was a painful and uncontrollable squeaking mixed in with it the words could be made out at first but then there was a sort of echo which made them unclear leaving the hearer unsure whether he had heard properly or not Gregor had wanted to give a full answer and explain everything but in the circumstances contented himself with saying Yes mother yes thankyou Im getting up now The change in Gregors voice probably could not be noticed outside through the wooden door as his mother was satisfied with this explanation and shuffled away But this short conversation made the other members of the family aware that Gregor against their expectations was still at home and soon his father came

knocking at one of the side doors gently but with his fist Gregor Gregor he called whats wrong And after a short while he called again with a warning deepness in his voice Gregor Gregor At the other side door his sister came plaintively Gregor Arent you well Do you need anything Gregor answered to both sides Im ready now making an effort to remove all the strangeness from his voice by enunciating very carefully and putting long pauses between each individual word. His father went back to his breakfast but his sister whispered Gregor open the door I beg of you Gregor however had no thought of opening the door and instead congratulated himself for his cautious habit acquired from his travelling of locking all doors at night even when he was at home

The first thing he wanted to do was to get up in peace without being disturbed to get dressed and most of all to have his breakfast Only then would he consider what to do next as he was well aware that he would not bring his thoughts to any sensible conclusions by lying in bed He remembered that he had often felt a slight pain in bed perhaps caused by lying awkwardly but that had always turned out to be pure imagination and he wondered how his imaginings would slowly resolve themselves today He did not have the slightest doubt that the change in his voice was nothing more than the first sign of a serious cold which was an occupational hazard for travelling salesmen

It was a simple matter to throw off the covers he only had to blow himself up a little and they fell off by themselves But it became difficult after that especially as he was so exceptionally broad He would have used his arms and his hands to push himself up but instead of them he only had all those little legs continuously moving in different directions and which he was moreover unable to control If he wanted to bend one of them then that was the first one that would stretch itself out and if he finally managed to do what he wanted with that leg all the others seemed to be set free and would move about painfully This is something that cant be done in bed Gregor said to himself so dont keep trying to do it

The first thing he wanted to do was get the lower part of his body out of the bed but he had never seen this lower part and could not imagine what it looked like it turned out to be too hard to move it went so slowly and finally almost in a frenzy when he carelessly shoved himself forwards with all the force he could gather he chose the wrong direction hit hard against the lower bedpost and learned from the burning pain he felt that the lower part of his body might well at present be the most sensitive

So then he tried to get the top part of his body out of the bed first carefully turning his head to the side. This he managed quite easily and despite its breadth and its weight the bulk of his body eventually followed slowly in the direction of the head. But when he had at last got his head out of the bed and into the fresh air it occurred to him that if he let himself fall it would be a miracle if his head were not injured so he became afraid to carry on pushing himself forward the same way. And he could not knock himself out now at any price better to stay in bed than lose consciousness

It took just as much effort to get back to where he had been earlier but when he lay there sighing and was once more watching his legs as they struggled against each other even harder than before if that was possible he could think of no way of bringing peace and order to this chaos He told himself once more that it

was not possible for him to stay in bed and that the most sensible thing to do would be to get free of it in whatever way he could at whatever sacrifice At the same time though he did not forget to remind himself that calm consideration was much better than rushing to desperate conclusions At times like this he would direct his eyes to the window and look out as clearly as he could but unfortunately even the other side of the narrow street was enveloped in morning fog and the view had little confidence or cheer to offer him Seven oclock already he said to himself when the clock struck again seven oclock and theres still a fog like this And he lay there quietly a while longer breathing lightly as if he perhaps expected the total stillness to bring things back to their real and natural state

But then he said to himself Before it strikes quarter past seven Ill definitely have to have got properly out of bed And by then somebody will have come round from work to ask whats happened to me as well as they open up at work before seven oclock And so he set himself to the task of swinging the entire length of his body out of the bed all at the same time If he succeeded in falling out of bed in this way and kept his head raised as he did so he could probably avoid injuring it His back seemed to be quite hard and probably nothing would happen to it falling onto the carpet His main concern was for the loud noise he was bound to make and which even through all the doors would probably raise concern if not alarm But it was something that had to be risked

When Gregor was already sticking half way out of the bed the new method was more of a game than an effort all he had to do was rock back and forth it occurred to him how simple everything would be if somebody came to help him Two strong people he had his father and the maid in mind would have been more than enough they would only have to push their arms under the dome of his back peel him away from the bed bend down with the load and then be patient and careful as he swang over onto the floor where hopefully the little legs would find a use Should he really call for help though even apart from the fact that all the doors were locked Despite all the difficulty he was in he could not suppress a smile at this thought

After a while he had already moved so far across that it would have been hard for him to keep his balance if he rocked too hard The time was now ten past seven and he would have to make a final decision very soon Then there was a ring at the door of the flat Thatll be someone from work he said to himself and froze very still although his little legs only became all the more lively as they danced around For a moment everything remained quiet Theyre not opening the door Gregor said to himself caught in some nonsensical hope But then of course the maids firm steps went to the door as ever and opened it Gregor only needed to hear the visitors first words of greeting and he knew who it was the chief clerk himself Why did Gregor have to be the only one condemned to work for a company where they immediately became highly suspicious at the slightest shortcoming Were all employees every one of them louts was there not one of them who was faithful and devoted who would go so mad with pangs of conscience that he couldnt get out of bed if he didnt spend at least a couple of hours in the morning on company business Was it really not enough to let one of the trainees make enquiries assuming enquiries were even necessary did the chief clerk have to come himself and did they have to show the whole innocent family that this was so suspicious that only the chief clerk could be trusted to have the wisdom to investigate it And more because these thoughts had made him upset than through any proper decision he swang himself with

all his force out of the bed There was a loud thump but it wasnt really a loud noise His fall was softened a little by the carpet and Gregors back was also more elastic than he had thought which made the sound muffled and not too noticeable He had not held his head carefully enough though and hit it as he fell annoyed and in pain he turned it and rubbed it against the carpet

Somethings fallen down in there said the chief clerk in the room on the left Gregor tried to imagine whether something of the sort that had happened to him today could ever happen to the chief clerk too you had to concede that it was possible But as if in gruff reply to this question the chief clerks firm footsteps in his highly polished boots could now be heard in the adjoining room From the room on his right Gregors sister whispered to him to let him know Gregor the chief clerk is here Yes I know said Gregor to himself but without daring to raise his voice loud enough for his sister to hear him

Gregor said his father now from the room to his left the chief clerk has come round and wants to know why you didnt leave on the early train We dont know what to say to him And anyway he wants to speak to you personally So please open up this door Im sure hell be good enough to forgive the untidiness of your room Then the chief clerk called Good morning Mr Samsa He isnt well said his mother to the chief clerk while his father continued to speak through the door He isnt well please believe me Why else would Gregor have missed a train The lad only ever thinks about the business It nearly makes me cross the way he never goes out in the evenings hes been in town for a week now but stayed home every evening He sits with us in the kitchen and just reads the paper or studies train timetables His idea of relaxation is working with his fretsaw Hes made a little frame for instance it only took him two or three evenings youll be amazed how nice it is its hanging up in his room youll see it as soon as Gregor opens the door Anyway Im glad youre here we wouldnt have been able to get Gregor to open the door by ourselves hes so stubborn and Im sure he isnt well he said this morning that he is but he isnt Ill be there in a moment said Gregor slowly and thoughtfully but without moving so that he would not miss any word of the conversation Well I cant think of any other way of explaining it Mrs Samsa said the chief clerk I hope its nothing serious But on the other hand I must say that if we people in commerce ever become slightly unwell then fortunately or unfortunately as you like we simply have to overcome it because of business considerations Can the chief clerk come in to see you now then asked his father impatiently knocking at the door again No said Gregor In the room on his right there followed a painful silence in the room on his left his sister began to cry

So why did his sister not go and join the others She had probably only just got up and had not even begun to get dressed. And why was she crying Was it because he had not got up and had not let the chief clerk in because he was in danger of losing his job and if that happened his boss would once more pursue their parents with the same demands as before There was no need to worry about things like that yet Gregor was still there and had not the slightest intention of abandoning his family. For the time being he just lay there on the carpet and noone who knew the condition he was in would seriously have expected him to let the chief clerk in. It was only a minor discourtesy and a suitable excuse could easily be found for it later on it was not something for which Gregor could be sacked on the spot. And it seemed to Gregor much more sensible to leave him now in peace instead of disturbing him with talking at him and crying. But the others didnt know what was happening they

The chief clerk now raised his voice Mr Samsa he called to him what is wrong You barricade yourself in your room give us no more than yes or no for an answer you are causing serious and unnecessary concern to your parents and you fail and I mention this just by the way you fail to carry out your business duties in a way that is quite unheard of Im speaking here on behalf of your parents and of your employer and really must request a clear and immediate explanation I am astonished quite astonished I thought I knew you as a calm and sensible person and now you suddenly seem to be showing off with peculiar whims This morning your employer did suggest a possible reason for your failure to appear its true it had to do with the money that was recently entrusted to you but I came near to giving him my word of honour that that could not be the right explanation But now that I see your incomprehensible stubbornness I no longer feel any wish whatsoever to intercede on your behalf And nor is your position all that secure I had originally intended to say all this to you in private but since you cause me to waste my time here for no good reason I dont see why your parents should not also learn of it Your turnover has been very unsatisfactory of late I grant you that its not the time of year to do especially good business we recognise that but there simply is no time of year to do no business at all Mr Samsa we cannot allow there to be

But Sir called Gregor beside himself and forgetting all else in the excitement Ill open up immediately just a moment Im slightly unwell an attack of dizziness I havent been able to get up Im still in bed now Im quite fresh again now though Im just getting out of bed Just a moment Be patient Its not quite as easy as Id thought Im quite alright now though Its shocking what can suddenly happen to a person I was quite alright last night my parents know about it perhaps better than me I had a small symptom of it last night already They must have noticed it I dont know why I didnt let you know at work But you always think you can get over an illness without staying at home Please dont make my parents suffer Theres no basis for any of the accusations youre making nobodys ever said a word to me about any of these things Maybe you havent read the latest contracts I sent in Ill set off with the eight oclock train as well these few hours of rest have given me strength You dont need to wait sir Ill be in the office soon after you and please be so good as to tell that to the boss and recommend me to him

And while Gregor gushed out these words hardly knowing what he was saying he made his way over to the chest of drawers this was easily done probably because of the practise he had already had in bed where he now tried to get himself upright He really did want to open the door really did want to let them see him and to speak with the chief clerk the others were being so insistent and he was curious to learn what they would say when they caught sight of him If they were shocked then it would no longer be Gregors responsibility and he could rest If however they took everything calmly he would still have no reason to be upset and if he hurried he really could be at the station for eight oclock. The first few times he tried to climb up on the smooth chest of drawers he just slid down again but he finally gave himself one last swing and stood there upright the lower part of his body was in serious pain but he no longer gave any attention to it Now he let himself fall against the back of a nearby chair and held tightly to the edges of it with his little legs By now he had also calmed down and kept quiet so that he could listen to what the chief clerk was saying

Did you understand a word of all that the chief clerk asked his parents surely hes not trying to make fools of us Oh God called his mother who was already in tears he could be seriously ill and were making him suffer Grete Grete she then cried Mother his sister called from the other side They communicated across Gregors room Youll have to go for the doctor straight away Gregor is ill Quick get the doctor Did you hear the way Gregor spoke just now That was the voice of an animal said the chief clerk with a calmness that was in contrast with his mothers screams Anna Anna his father called into the kitchen through the entrance hall clapping his hands get a locksmith here now And the two girls their skirts swishing immediately ran out through the hall wrenching open the front door of the flat as they went How had his sister managed to get dressed so quickly There was no sound of the door banging shut again they must have left it open people often do in homes where something awful has happened

Gregor in contrast had become much calmer So they couldnt understand his words any more although they seemed clear enough to him clearer than before perhaps his ears had become used to the sound They had realised though that there was something wrong with him and were ready to help The first response to his situation had been confident and wise and that made him feel better He felt that he had been drawn back in among people and from the doctor and the locksmith he expected great and surprising achievements although he did not really distinguish one from the other Whatever was said next would be crucial so in order to make his voice as clear as possible he coughed a little but taking care to do this not too loudly as even this might well sound different from the way that a human coughs and he was no longer sure he could judge this for himself Meanwhile it had become very quiet in the next room Perhaps his parents were sat at the table whispering with the chief clerk or perhaps they were all pressed against the door and listening

Gregor slowly pushed his way over to the door with the chair Once there he let go of it and threw himself onto the door holding himself upright against it using the adhesive on the tips of his legs He rested there a little while to recover from the effort involved and then set himself to the task of turning the key in the lock with his mouth He seemed unfortunately to have no proper teeth how was he then to grasp the key but the lack of teeth was of course made up for with a very strong jaw using the jaw he really was able to start the key turning ignoring the fact that he must have been causing some kind of damage as a brown fluid came from his mouth flowed over the key and dripped onto the floor Listen said the chief clerk in the next room hes turning the key Gregor was greatly encouraged by this but they all should have been calling to him his father and his mother too Well done Gregor they should have cried keep at it keep hold of the lock And with the idea that they were all excitedly following his efforts he bit on the key with all his strength paying no attention to the pain he was causing himself As the key turned round he turned around the lock with it only holding himself upright with his mouth and hung onto the key or pushed it down again with the whole weight of his body as needed The clear sound of the lock as it snapped back was Gregors sign that he could break his concentration and as he regained his breath he said to himself So I didnt need the locksmith after all Then he lay his head on the handle of the door to open it completely

Because he had to open the door in this way it was already wide open before he could be seen. He had first to slowly turn himself around one of the double doors and he had to do it very carefully if he did not want to fall flat on his back before entering the room. He was still occupied with this difficult movement unable to pay attention to anything else when he heard the chief clerk exclaim a loud Oh which sounded like the soughing of the wind. Now he also saw him he was the nearest to the door his hand pressed against his open mouth and slowly retreating as if driven by a steady and invisible force. Gregors mother her hair still dishevelled from bed despite the chief clerks being there looked at his father. Then she unfolded her arms took two steps forward towards Gregor and sank down onto the floor into her skirts that spread themselves out around her as her head disappeared down onto her breast. His father looked hostile and clenched his fists as if wanting to knock Gregor back into his room. Then he looked uncertainly round the living room covered his eyes with his hands and wept so that his powerful chest shook.

So Gregor did not go into the room but leant against the inside of the other door which was still held bolted in place In this way only half of his body could be seen along with his head above it which he leant over to one side as he peered out at the others Meanwhile the day had become much lighter part of the endless greyblack building on the other side of the street which was a hospital could be seen quite clearly with the austere and regular line of windows piercing its facade the rain was still falling now throwing down large individual droplets which hit the ground one at a time The washing up from breakfast lay on the table there was so much of it because for Gregors father breakfast was the most important meal of the day and he would stretch it out for several hours as he sat reading a number of different newspapers On the wall exactly opposite there was photograph of Gregor when he was a lieutenant in the army his sword in his hand and a carefree smile on his face as he called forth respect for his uniform and bearing The door to the entrance hall was open and as the front door of the flat was also open he could see onto the landing and the stairs where they began their way down below

Now then said Gregor well aware that he was the only one to have kept calm Ill get dressed straight away now pack up my samples and set off Will you please just let me leave You can see he said to the chief clerk that Im not stubborn and I like to do my job being a commercial traveller is arduous but without travelling I couldnt earn my living So where are you going in to the office Yes Will you report everything accurately then Its quite possible for someone to be temporarily unable to work but thats just the right time to remember whats been achieved in the past and consider that later on once the difficulty has been removed he will certainly work with all the more diligence and concentration Youre well aware that Im seriously in debt to our employer as well as having to look after my parents and my sister so that Im trapped in a difficult situation but I will work my way out of it again Please dont make things any harder for me than they are already and dont take sides against me at the office I know that nobody likes the travellers They think we earn an enormous wage as well as having a soft time of it Thats just prejudice but they have no particular reason to think better of it But you sir you have a better overview than the rest of the staff in fact if I can say this in confidence a better overview than the boss himself its very easy for a businessman like him to make mistakes about his employees and judge them more harshly than he should And youre also well aware that we travellers spend almost the whole year away from the office so that we can very easily fall victim to gossip and chance and groundless complaints and its almost impossible to defend yourself from that sort of

thing we dont usually even hear about them or if at all its when we arrive back home exhausted from a trip and thats when we feel the harmful effects of whats been going on without even knowing what caused them Please dont go away at least first say something to show that you grant that Im at least partly right

But the chief clerk had turned away as soon as Gregor had started to speak and with protruding lips only stared back at him over his trembling shoulders as he left. He did not keep still for a moment while Gregor was speaking but moved steadily towards the door without taking his eyes off him. He moved very gradually as if there had been some secret prohibition on leaving the room. It was only when he had reached the entrance hall that he made a sudden movement drew his foot from the living room and rushed forward in a panic. In the hall he stretched his right hand far out towards the stairway as if out there there were some supernatural force waiting to save him

Gregor realised that it was out of the question to let the chief clerk go away in this mood if his position in the firm was not to be put into extreme danger That was something his parents did not understand very well over the years they had become convinced that this job would provide for Gregor for his entire life and besides they had so much to worry about at present that they had lost sight of any thought for the future Gregor though did think about the future The chief clerk had to be held back calmed down convinced and finally won over the future of Gregor and his family depended on it If only his sister were here She was clever she was already in tears while Gregor was still lying peacefully on his back And the chief clerk was a lover of women surely she could persuade him she would close the front door in the entrance hall and talk him out of his shocked state But his sister was not there Gregor would have to do the job himself And without considering that he still was not familiar with how well he could move about in his present state or that his speech still might not or probably would not be understood he let go of the door pushed himself through the opening tried to reach the chief clerk on the landing who ridiculously was holding on to the banister with both hands but Gregor fell immediately over and with a little scream as he sought something to hold onto landed on his numerous little legs Hardly had that happened than for the first time that day he began to feel alright with his body the little legs had the solid ground under them to his pleasure they did exactly as he told them they were even making the effort to carry him where he wanted to go and he was soon believing that all his sorrows would soon be finally at an end He held back the urge to move but swayed from side to side as he crouched there on the floor His mother was not far away in front of him and seemed at first quite engrossed in herself but then she suddenly jumped up with her arms outstretched and her fingers spread shouting Help for pitys sake Help The way she held her head suggested she wanted to see Gregor better but the unthinking way she was hurrying backwards showed that she did not she had forgotten that the table was behind her with all the breakfast things on it when she reached the table she sat quickly down on it without knowing what she was doing without even seeming to notice that the coffee pot had been knocked over and a gush of coffee was pouring down onto the carpet

Mother mother said Gregor gently looking up at her He had completely forgotten the chief clerk for the moment but could not help himself snapping in the air with his jaws at the sight of the flow of coffee That set his mother screaming anew she fled from the table and into the arms of his father as he rushed towards her Gregor though had no time to spare for his parents now the chief

clerk had already reached the stairs with his chin on the banister he looked back for the last time Gregor made a run for him he wanted to be sure of reaching him the chief clerk must have expected something as he leapt down several steps at once and disappeared his shouts resounding all around the staircase The flight of the chief clerk seemed unfortunately to put Gregors father into a panic as well Until then he had been relatively self controlled but now instead of running after the chief clerk himself or at least not impeding Gregor as he ran after him Gregors father seized the chief clerks stick in his right hand the chief clerk had left it behind on a chair along with his hat and overcoat picked up a large newspaper from the table with his left and used them to drive Gregor back into his room stamping his foot at him as he went Gregors appeals to his father were of no help his appeals were simply not understood however much he humbly turned his head his father merely stamped his foot all the harder Across the room despite the chilly weather Gregors mother had pulled open a window leant far out of it and pressed her hands to her face A strong draught of air flew in from the street towards the stairway the curtains flew up the newspapers on the table fluttered and some of them were blown onto the floor Nothing would stop Gregors father as he drove him back making hissing noises at him like a wild man Gregor had never had any practice in moving backwards and was only able to go very slowly If Gregor had only been allowed to turn round he would have been back in his room straight away but he was afraid that if he took the time to do that his father would become impatient and there was the threat of a lethal blow to his back or head from the stick in his fathers hand any moment Eventually though Gregor realised that he had no choice as he saw to his disgust that he was quite incapable of going backwards in a straight line so he began as quickly as possible and with frequent anxious glances at his father to turn himself round It went very slowly but perhaps his father was able to see his good intentions as he did nothing to hinder him in fact now and then he used the tip of his stick to give directions from a distance as to which way to turn If only his father would stop that unbearable hissing It was making Gregor quite confused When he had nearly finished turning round still listening to that hissing he made a mistake and turned himself back a little the way he had just come He was pleased when he finally had his head in front of the doorway but then saw that it was too narrow and his body was too broad to get through it without further difficulty In his present mood it obviously did not occur to his father to open the other of the double doors so that Gregor would have enough space to get through He was merely fixed on the idea that Gregor should be got back into his room as quickly as possible Nor would he ever have allowed Gregor the time to get himself upright as preparation for getting through the doorway What he did making more noise than ever was to drive Gregor forwards all the harder as if there had been nothing in the way it sounded to Gregor as if there was now more than one father behind him it was not a pleasant experience and Gregor pushed himself into the doorway without regard for what might happen One side of his body lifted itself he lay at an angle in the doorway one flank scraped on the white door and was painfully injured leaving vile brown flecks on it soon he was stuck fast and would not have been able to move at all by himself the little legs along one side hung quivering in the air while those on the other side were pressed painfully against the ground Then his father gave him a hefty shove from behind which released him from where he was held and sent him flying and heavily bleeding deep into his room The door was slammed shut with the stick then finally all was quiet

It was not until it was getting dark that evening that Gregor awoke from his deep and comalike sleep. He would have woken soon afterwards anyway even if he hadnt been disturbed as he had had enough sleep and felt fully rested. But he had the impression that some hurried steps and the sound of the door leading into the front room being carefully shut had woken him. The light from the electric street lamps shone palely here and there onto the ceiling and tops of the furniture but down below where Gregor was it was dark. He pushed himself over to the door feeling his way clumsily with his antennae of which he was now beginning to learn the value in order to see what had been happening there. The whole of his left side seemed like one painfully stretched scar and he limped badly on his two rows of legs. One of the legs had been badly injured in the events of that morning it was nearly a miracle that only one of them had been and dragged along lifelessly.

It was only when he had reached the door that he realised what it actually was that had drawn him over to it it was the smell of something to eat By the door there was a dish filled with sweetened milk with little pieces of white bread floating in it He was so pleased he almost laughed as he was even hungrier than he had been that morning and immediately dipped his head into the milk nearly covering his eyes with it But he soon drew his head back again in disappointment not only did the pain in his tender left side make it difficult to eat the food he was only able to eat if his whole body worked together as a snuffling whole but the milk did not taste at all nice Milk like this was normally his favourite drink and his sister had certainly left it there for him because of that but he turned almost against his own will away from the dish and crawled back into the centre of the room

His father at this time would normally be sat with his evening paper reading it out in a loud voice to Gregors mother and sometimes to his sister but there was now not a sound to be heard. Gregors sister would often write and tell him about this reading but maybe his father had lost the habit in recent times. It was so quiet all around too even though there must have been somebody in the flat. What a quiet life it is the family lead said Gregor to himself and gazing into the darkness felt a great pride that he was able to provide a life like that in such a nice home for his sister and parents. But what now if all this peace and wealth and comfort should come to a horrible and frightening end That was something that Gregor did not want to think about too much so he started to move about crawling up and down the room.

Once during that long evening the door on one side of the room was opened very slightly and hurriedly closed again later on the door on the other side did the same it seemed that someone needed to enter the room but thought better of it Gregor went and waited immediately by the door resolved either to bring the timorous visitor into the room in some way or at least to find out who it was but the door was opened no more that night and Gregor waited in vain The previous morning while the doors were locked everyone had wanted to get in there to him but now now that he had opened up one of the doors and the other had clearly been unlocked some time during the day noone came and the keys were in the other sides

was put out and now it was easy to see that his parents and sister had stayed awake all that time as they all could be distinctly heard as they went away together on tiptoe. It was clear that noone would come into Gregors room any more until morning that gave him plenty of time to think undisturbed about how he would have to rearrange his life. For some reason the tall empty room where he was forced to remain made him feel uneasy as he lay there flat on the floor even though he had been living in it for five years. Hardly aware of what he was doing other than a slight feeling of shame he hurried under the couch. It pressed down on his back a little and he was no longer able to lift his head but he nonetheless felt immediately at ease and his only regret was that his body was too broad to get it all underneath.

He spent the whole night there Some of the time he passed in a light sleep although he frequently woke from it in alarm because of his hunger and some of the time was spent in worries and vague hopes which however always led to the same conclusion for the time being he must remain calm he must show patience and the greatest consideration so that his family could bear the unpleasantness that he in his present condition was forced to impose on them

Gregor soon had the opportunity to test the strength of his decisions as early the next morning almost before the night had ended his sister nearly fully dressed opened the door from the front room and looked anxiously in She did not see him straight away but when she did notice him under the couch he had to be somewhere for Gods sake he couldn't have flown away she was so shocked that she lost control of herself and slammed the door shut again from outside But she seemed to regret her behaviour as she opened the door again straight away and came in on tiptoe as if entering the room of someone seriously ill or even of a stranger Gregor had pushed his head forward right to the edge of the couch and watched her Would she notice that he had left the milk as it was realise that it was not from any lack of hunger and bring him in some other food that was more suitable If she didnt do it herself he would rather go hungry than draw her attention to it although he did feel a terrible urge to rush forward from under the couch throw himself at his sisters feet and beg her for something good to eat However his sister noticed the full dish immediately and looked at it and the few drops of milk splashed around it with some surprise She immediately picked it up using a rag not her bare hands and carried it out Gregor was extremely curious as to what she would bring in its place imagining the wildest possibilities but he never could have guessed what his sister in her goodness actually did bring In order to test his taste she brought him a whole selection of things all spread out on an old newspaper There were old halfrotten vegetables bones from the evening meal covered in white sauce that had gone hard a few raisins and almonds some cheese that Gregor had declared inedible two days before a dry roll and some bread spread with butter and salt As well as all that she had poured some water into the dish which had probably been permanently set aside for Gregors use and placed it beside them Then out of consideration for Gregors feelings as she knew that he would not eat in front of her she hurried out again and even turned the key in the lock so that Gregor would know he could make things as comfortable for himself as he liked Gregors little legs whirred at last he could eat Whats more his injuries must already have completely healed as he found no difficulty in moving This amazed him as more than a month earlier he had cut his finger slightly with a knife he thought of how his finger had still hurt the day before yesterday Am I less sensitive than I used to be then he thought and was

already sucking greedily at the cheese which had immediately almost compellingly attracted him much more than the other foods on the newspaper Quickly one after another his eyes watering with pleasure he consumed the cheese the vegetables and the sauce the fresh foods on the other hand he didnt like at all and even dragged the things he did want to eat a little way away from them because he couldnt stand the smell Long after he had finished eating and lay lethargic in the same place his sister slowly turned the key in the lock as a sign to him that he should withdraw He was immediately startled although he had been half asleep and he hurried back under the couch But he needed great selfcontrol to stay there even for the short time that his sister was in the room as eating so much food had rounded out his body a little and he could hardly breathe in that narrow space Half suffocating he watched with bulging eyes as his sister unselfconsciously took a broom and swept up the leftovers mixing them in with the food he had not even touched at all as if it could not be used any more She quickly dropped it all into a bin closed it with its wooden lid and carried everything out She had hardly turned her back before Gregor came out again from under the couch and stretched himself

This was how Gregor received his food each day now once in the morning while his parents and the maid were still asleep and the second time after everyone had eaten their meal at midday as his parents would sleep for a little while then as well and Gregors sister would send the maid away on some errand Gregors father and mother certainly did not want him to starve either but perhaps it would have been more than they could stand to have any more experience of his feeding than being told about it and perhaps his sister wanted to spare them what distress she could as they were indeed suffering enough

It was impossible for Gregor to find out what they had told the doctor and the locksmith that first morning to get them out of the flat As nobody could understand him nobody not even his sister thought that he could understand them so he had to be content to hear his sisters sighs and appeals to the saints as she moved about his room It was only later when she had become a little more used to everything there was of course no question of her ever becoming fully used to the situation that Gregor would sometimes catch a friendly comment or at least a comment that could be construed as friendly Hes enjoyed his dinner today she might say when he had diligently cleared away all the food left for him or if he left most of it which slowly became more and more frequent she would often say sadly now everythings just been left there again

Although Gregor wasnt able to hear any news directly he did listen to much of what was said in the next rooms and whenever he heard anyone speaking he would scurry straight to the appropriate door and press his whole body against it There was seldom any conversation especially at first that was not about him in some way even if only in secret For two whole days all the talk at every mealtime was about what they should do now but even between meals they spoke about the same subject as there were always at least two members of the family at home nobody wanted to be at home by themselves and it was out of the question to leave the flat entirely empty And on the very first day the maid had fallen to her knees and begged Gregors mother to let her go without delay It was not very clear how much she knew of what had happened but she left within a quarter of an hour tearfully thanking Gregors mother for her dismissal as if she had done her an enormous service She even swore emphatically not to tell anyone the slightest about what had

Now Gregors sister also had to help his mother with the cooking although that was not so much bother as noone ate very much Gregor often heard how one of them would unsuccessfully urge another to eat and receive no more answer than no thanks Ive had enough or something similar Noone drank very much either His sister would sometimes ask his father whether he would like a beer hoping for the chance to go and fetch it herself When his father then said nothing she would add so that he would not feel selfish that she could send the housekeeper for it but then his father would close the matter with a big loud No and no more would be said

Even before the first day had come to an end his father had explained to Gregors mother and sister what their finances and prospects were Now and then he stood up from the table and took some receipt or document from the little cash box he had saved from his business when it had collapsed five years earlier Gregor heard how he opened the complicated lock and then closed it again after he had taken the item he wanted What he heard his father say was some of the first good news that Gregor heard since he had first been incarcerated in his room He had thought that nothing at all remained from his fathers business at least he had never told him anything different and Gregor had never asked him about it anyway Their business misfortune had reduced the family to a state of total despair and Gregors only concern at that time had been to arrange things so that they could all forget about it as quickly as possible So then he started working especially hard with a fiery vigour that raised him from a junior salesman to a travelling representative almost overnight bringing with it the chance to earn money in quite different ways Gregor converted his success at work straight into cash that he could lay on the table at home for the benefit of his astonished and delighted family They had been good times and they had never come again at least not with the same splendour even though Gregor had later earned so much that he was in a position to bear the costs of the whole family and did bear them They had even got used to it both Gregor and the family they took the money with gratitude and he was glad to provide it although there was no longer much warm affection given in return Gregor only remained close to his sister now Unlike him she was very fond of music and a gifted and expressive violinist it was his secret plan to send her to the conservatory next year even though it would cause great expense that would have to be made up for in some other way During Gregors short periods in town conversation with his sister would often turn to the conservatory but it was only ever mentioned as a lovely dream that could never be realised Their parents did not like to hear this innocent talk but Gregor thought about it quite hard and decided he would let them know what he planned with a grand announcement of it on Christmas day

That was the sort of totally pointless thing that went through his mind in his present state pressed upright against the door and listening There were times when he simply became too tired to continue listening when his head would fall wearily against the door and he would pull it up again with a start as even the slightest noise he caused would be heard next door and they would all go silent Whats that hes doing now his father would say after a while clearly having gone over to the door and only then would the interrupted conversation slowly be taken up again

When explaining things his father repeated himself several times partly because it was a long time since he had been occupied with these matters himself and partly because Gregors mother did not understand everything the first time From these repeated explanations

Gregor learned to his pleasure that despite all their misfortunes there was still some money available from the old days. It was not a lot but it had not been touched in the meantime and some interest had accumulated. Besides that they had not been using up all the money that Gregor had been bringing home every month keeping only a little for himself so that that too had been accumulating. Behind the door Gregor nodded with enthusiasm in his pleasure at this unexpected thrift and caution. He could actually have used this surplus money to reduce his fathers debt to his boss and the day when he could have freed himself from that job would have come much closer but now it was certainly better the way his father had done things

This money however was certainly not enough to enable the family to live off the interest it was enough to maintain them for perhaps one or two years no more Thats to say it was money that should not really be touched but set aside for emergencies money to live on had to be earned His father was healthy but old and lacking in self confidence During the five years that he had not been working the first holiday in a life that had been full of strain and no success he had put on a lot of weight and become very slow and clumsy Would Gregors elderly mother now have to go and earn money She suffered from asthma and it was a strain for her just to move about the home every other day would be spent struggling for breath on the sofa by the open window Would his sister have to go and earn money She was still a child of seventeen her life up till then had been very enviable consisting of wearing nice clothes sleeping late helping out in the business joining in with a few modest pleasures and most of all playing the violin Whenever they began to talk of the need to earn money Gregor would always first let go of the door and then throw himself onto the cool leather sofa next to it as he became quite hot with shame and regret

He would often lie there the whole night through not sleeping a wink but scratching at the leather for hours on end Or he might go to all the effort of pushing a chair to the window climbing up onto the sill and propped up in the chair leaning on the window to stare out of it He had used to feel a great sense of freedom from doing this but doing it now was obviously something more remembered than experienced as what he actually saw in this way was becoming less distinct every day even things that were quite near he had used to curse the everpresent view of the hospital across the street but now he could not see it at all and if he had not known that he lived in Charlottenstrasse which was a quiet street despite being in the middle of the city he could have thought that he was looking out the window at a barren waste where the grey sky and the grey earth mingled inseparably His observant sister only needed to notice the chair twice before she would always push it back to its exact position by the window after she had tidied up the room and even left the inner pane of the window open from then on

If Gregor had only been able to speak to his sister and thank her for all that she had to do for him it would have been easier for him to bear it but as it was it caused him pain. His sister naturally tried as far as possible to pretend there was nothing burdensome about it and the longer it went on of course the better she was able to do so but as time went by Gregor was also able to see through it all so much better. It had even become very unpleasant for him now whenever she entered the room. No sooner had she come in than she would quickly close the door as a precaution so that noone would have to suffer the view into Gregors room then she would go straight to the window and pull it hurriedly open almost as if she were suffocating. Even if it was

cold she would stay at the window breathing deeply for a little while She would alarm Gregor twice a day with this running about and noise making he would stay under the couch shivering the whole while knowing full well that she would certainly have liked to spare him this ordeal but it was impossible for her to be in the same room with him with the windows closed

One day about a month after Gregors transformation when his sister no longer had any particular reason to be shocked at his appearance she came into the room a little earlier than usual and found him still staring out the window motionless and just where he would be most horrible In itself his sisters not coming into the room would have been no surprise for Gregor as it would have been difficult for her to immediately open the window while he was still there but not only did she not come in she went straight back and closed the door behind her a stranger would have thought he had threatened her and tried to bite her Gregor went straight to hide himself under the couch of course but he had to wait until midday before his sister came back and she seemed much more uneasy than usual It made him realise that she still found his appearance unbearable and would continue to do so she probably even had to overcome the urge to flee when she saw the little bit of him that protruded from under the couch One day in order to spare her even this sight he spent four hours carrying the bedsheet over to the couch on his back and arranged it so that he was completely covered and his sister would not be able to see him even if she bent down If she did not think this sheet was necessary then all she had to do was take it off again as it was clear enough that it was no pleasure for Gregor to cut himself off so completely She left the sheet where it was Gregor even thought he glimpsed a look of gratitude one time when he carefully looked out from under the sheet to see how his sister liked the new arrangement

For the first fourteen days Gregors parents could not bring themselves to come into the room to see him He would often hear them say how they appreciated all the new work his sister was doing even though before they had seen her as a girl who was somewhat useless and frequently been annoyed with her But now the two of them father and mother would often both wait outside the door of Gregors room while his sister tidied up in there and as soon as she went out again she would have to tell them exactly how everything looked what Gregor had eaten how he had behaved this time and whether perhaps any slight improvement could be seen His mother also wanted to go in and visit Gregor relatively soon but his father and sister at first persuaded her against it Gregor listened very closely to all this and approved fully Later though she had to be held back by force which made her call out Let me go and see Gregor he is my unfortunate son Cant you understand I have to see him and Gregor would think to himself that maybe it would be better if his mother came in not every day of course but one day a week perhaps she could understand everything much better than his sister who for all her courage was still just a child after all and really might not have had an adults appreciation of the burdensome job she had taken on

Gregors wish to see his mother was soon realised Out of consideration for his parents Gregor wanted to avoid being seen at the window during the day the few square meters of the floor did not give him much room to crawl about it was hard to just lie quietly through the night his food soon stopped giving him any pleasure at all and so to entertain himself he got into the habit of crawling up and down the walls and ceiling He was especially fond of hanging from the ceiling it was quite different from lying on the floor he could breathe more freely his body had a light

swing to it and up there relaxed and almost happy it might happen that he would surprise even himself by letting go of the ceiling and landing on the floor with a crash But now of course he had far better control of his body than before and even with a fall as great as that caused himself no damage Very soon his sister noticed Gregors new way of entertaining himself he had after all left traces of the adhesive from his feet as he crawled about and got it into her head to make it as easy as possible for him by removing the furniture that got in his way especially the chest of drawers and the desk Now this was not something that she would be able to do by herself she did not dare to ask for help from her father the sixteen year old maid had carried on bravely since the cook had left but she certainly would not have helped in this she had even asked to be allowed to keep the kitchen locked at all times and never to have to open the door unless it was especially important so his sister had no choice but to choose some time when Gregors father was not there and fetch his mother to help her As she approached the room Gregor could hear his mother express her joy but once at the door she went silent First of course his sister came in and looked round to see that everything in the room was alright and only then did she let her mother enter Gregor had hurriedly pulled the sheet down lower over the couch and put more folds into it so that everything really looked as if it had just been thrown down by chance Gregor also refrained this time from spying out from under the sheet he gave up the chance to see his mother until later and was simply glad that she had come You can come in he cant be seen said his sister obviously leading her in by the hand The old chest of drawers was too heavy for a pair of feeble women to be heaving about but Gregor listened as they pushed it from its place his sister always taking on the heaviest part of the work for herself and ignoring her mothers warnings that she would strain herself This lasted a very long time After labouring at it for fifteen minutes or more his mother said it would be better to leave the chest where it was for one thing it was too heavy for them to get the job finished before Gregors father got home and leaving it in the middle of the room it would be in his way even more and for another thing it wasnt even sure that taking the furniture away would really be any help to him She thought just the opposite the sight of the bare walls saddened her right to her heart and why wouldnt Gregor feel the same way about it hed been used to this furniture in his room for a long time and it would make him feel abandoned to be in an empty room like that Then quietly almost whispering as if wanting Gregor whose whereabouts she did not know to hear not even the tone of her voice as she was convinced that he did not understand her words she added and by taking the furniture away wont it seem like were showing that weve given up all hope of improvement and were abandoning him to cope for himself I think itd be best to leave the room exactly the way it was before so that when Gregor comes back to us again hell find everything unchanged and hell be able to forget the time in between all the easier

Hearing these words from his mother made Gregor realise that the lack of any direct human communication along with the monotonous life led by the family during these two months must have made him confused he could think of no other way of explaining to himself why he had seriously wanted his room emptied out Had he really wanted to transform his room into a cave a warm room fitted out with the nice furniture he had inherited That would have let him crawl around unimpeded in any direction but it would also have let him quickly forget his past when he had still been human He had come very close to forgetting and it had only been the voice of his mother unheard for so long that had shaken him out of it Nothing should be removed everything had to stay he could not do without

His sister unfortunately did not agree she had become used to the idea not without reason that she was Gregors spokesman to his parents about the things that concerned him This meant that his mothers advice now was sufficient reason for her to insist on removing not only the chest of drawers and the desk as she had thought at first but all the furniture apart from the allimportant couch It was more than childish perversity of course or the unexpected confidence she had recently acquired that made her insist she had indeed noticed that Gregor needed a lot of room to crawl about in whereas the furniture as far as anyone could see was of no use to him at all Girls of that age though do become enthusiastic about things and feel they must get their way whenever they can Perhaps this was what tempted Grete to make Gregors situation seem even more shocking than it was so that she could do even more for him Grete would probably be the only one who would dare enter a room dominated by Gregor crawling about the bare walls by himself

So she refused to let her mother dissuade her Gregors mother already looked uneasy in his room she soon stopped speaking and helped Gregors sister to get the chest of drawers out with what strength she had The chest of drawers was something that Gregor could do without if he had to but the writing desk had to stay Hardly had the two women pushed the chest of drawers groaning out of the room than Gregor poked his head out from under the couch to see what he could do about it He meant to be as careful and considerate as he could but unfortunately it was his mother who came back first while Grete in the next room had her arms round the chest pushing and pulling at it from side to side by herself without of course moving it an inch His mother was not used to the sight of Gregor he might have made her ill so Gregor hurried backwards to the far end of the couch In his startlement though he was not able to prevent the sheet at its front from moving a little It was enough to attract his mothers attention She stood very still remained there a moment and then went back out to Grete

Gregor kept trying to assure himself that nothing unusual was happening it was just a few pieces of furniture being moved after all but he soon had to admit that the women going to and fro their little calls to each other the scraping of the furniture on the floor all these things made him feel as if he were being assailed from all sides With his head and legs pulled in against him and his body pressed to the floor he was forced to admit to himself that he could not stand all of this much longer They were emptying his room out taking away everything that was dear to him they had already taken out the chest containing his fretsaw and other tools now they threatened to remove the writing desk with its place clearly worn into the floor the desk where he had done his homework as a business trainee at high school even while he had been at infant schoolhe really could not wait any longer to see whether the two womens intentions were good He had nearly forgotten they were there anyway as they were now too tired to say anything while they worked and he could only hear their feet as they stepped heavily on the floor

So while the women were leant against the desk in the other room catching their breath he sallied out changed direction four times not knowing what he should save first before his attention was suddenly caught by the picture on the wall which was already

denuded of everything else that had been on it of the lady dressed in copious fur He hurried up onto the picture and pressed himself against its glass it held him firmly and felt good on his hot belly This picture at least now totally covered by Gregor would certainly be taken away by noone He turned his head to face the door into the living room so that he could watch the women when they came back

They had not allowed themselves a long rest and came back quite soon Grete had put her arm around her mother and was nearly carrying her What shall we take now then said Grete and looked around Her eyes met those of Gregor on the wall Perhaps only because her mother was there she remained calm bent her face to her so that she would not look round and said albeit hurriedly and with a tremor in her voice Come on lets go back in the living room for a while Gregor could see what Grete had in mind she wanted to take her mother somewhere safe and then chase him down from the wall Well she could certainly try it He sat unyielding on his picture He would rather jump at Gretes face

But Gretes words had made her mother quite worried she stepped to one side saw the enormous brown patch against the flowers of the wallpaper and before she even realised it was Gregor that she saw screamed Oh God oh God Arms outstretched she fell onto the couch as if she had given up everything and stayed there immobile Gregor shouted his sister glowering at him and shaking her fist That was the first word she had spoken to him directly since his transformation She ran into the other room to fetch some kind of smelling salts to bring her mother out of her faint Gregor wanted to help too he could save his picture later although he stuck fast to the glass and had to pull himself off by force then he too ran into the next room as if he could advise his sister like in the old days but he had to just stand behind her doing nothing she was looking into various bottles he startled her when she turned round a bottle fell to the ground and broke a splinter cut Gregors face some kind of caustic medicine splashed all over him now without delaying any longer Grete took hold of all the bottles she could and ran with them in to her mother she slammed the door shut with her foot So now Gregor was shut out from his mother who because of him might be near to death he could not open the door if he did not want to chase his sister away and she had to stay with his mother there was nothing for him to do but wait and oppressed with anxiety and selfreproach he began to crawl about he crawled over everything walls furniture ceiling and finally in his confusion as the whole room began to spin around him he fell down into the middle of the dinner table

He lay there for a while numb and immobile all around him it was quiet maybe that was a good sign Then there was someone at the door The maid of course had locked herself in her kitchen so that Grete would have to go and answer it His father had arrived home Whats happened were his first words Gretes appearance must have made everything clear to him She answered him with subdued voice and openly pressed her face into his chest Mothers fainted but shes better now Gregor got out Just as I expected said his father just as I always said but you women wouldnt listen would you It was clear to Gregor that Grete had not said enough and that his father took it to mean that something bad had happened that he was responsible for some act of violence That meant Gregor would now have to try to calm his father as he did not have the time to explain things to him even if that had been possible So he fled to the door of his room and pressed himself against it so that his father when he came in from the hall could see straight away that Gregor had the best intentions and would go

back into his room without delay that it would not be necessary to drive him back but that they had only to open the door and he would disappear

His father though was not in the mood to notice subtleties like that Ah he shouted as he came in sounding as if he were both angry and glad at the same time Gregor drew his head back from the door and lifted it towards his father He really had not imagined his father the way he stood there now of late with his new habit of crawling about he had neglected to pay attention to what was going on the rest of the flat the way he had done before He really ought to have expected things to have changed but still still was that really his father The same tired man as used to be laying there entombed in his bed when Gregor came back from his business trips who would receive him sitting in the armchair in his nightgown when he came back in the evenings who was hardly even able to stand up but as a sign of his pleasure would just raise his arms and who on the couple of times a year when they went for a walk together on a Sunday or public holiday wrapped up tightly in his overcoat between Gregor and his mother would always labour his way forward a little more slowly than them who were already walking slowly for his sake who would place his stick down carefully and if he wanted to say something would invariably stop and gather his companions around him He was standing up straight enough now dressed in a smart blue uniform with gold buttons the sort worn by the employees at the banking institute above the high stiff collar of the coat his strong doublechin emerged under the bushy eyebrows his piercing dark eyes looked out fresh and alert his normally unkempt white hair was combed down painfully close to his scalp He took his cap with its gold monogram from probably some bank and threw it in an arc right across the room onto the sofa put his hands in his trouser pockets pushing back the bottom of his long uniform coat and with look of determination walked towards Gregor He probably did not even know himself what he had in mind but nonetheless lifted his feet unusually high Gregor was amazed at the enormous size of the soles of his boots but wasted no time with that he knew full well right from the first day of his new life that his father thought it necessary to always be extremely strict with him And so he ran up to his father stopped when his father stopped scurried forwards again when he moved even slightly In this way they went round the room several times without anything decisive happening without even giving the impression of a chase as everything went so slowly Gregor remained all this time on the floor largely because he feared his father might see it as especially provoking if he fled onto the wall or ceiling Whatever he did Gregor had to admit that he certainly would not be able to keep up this running about for long as for each step his father took he had to carry out countless movements He became noticeably short of breath even in his earlier life his lungs had not been very reliable Now as he lurched about in his efforts to muster all the strength he could for running he could hardly keep his eyes open his thoughts became too slow for him to think of any other way of saving himself than running he almost forgot that the walls were there for him to use although here they were concealed behind carefully carved furniture full of notches and protrusions then right beside him lightly tossed something flew down and rolled in front of him It was an apple then another one immediately flew at him Gregor froze in shock there was no longer any point in running as his father had decided to bombard him He had filled his pockets with fruit from the bowl on the sideboard and now without even taking the time for careful aim threw one apple after another These little red apples rolled about on the floor knocking into each other as if they had electric motors An apple thrown without much force glanced against Gregors back and slid off

without doing any harm Another one however immediately following it hit squarely and lodged in his back Gregor wanted to drag himself away as if he could remove the surprising the incredible pain by changing his position but he felt as if nailed to the spot and spread himself out all his senses in confusion The last thing he saw was the door of his room being pulled open his sister was screaming his mother ran out in front of her in her blouse as his sister had taken off some of her clothes after she had fainted to make it easier for her to breathe she ran to his father her skirts unfastened and sliding one after another to the ground stumbling over the skirts she pushed herself to his father her arms around him uniting herself with him totally now Gregor lost his ability to see anything her hands behind his fathers head begging him to spare Gregors life

Noone dared to remove the apple lodged in Gregors flesh so it remained there as a visible reminder of his injury. He had suffered it there for more than a month and his condition seemed serious enough to remind even his father that Gregor despite his current sad and revolting form was a family member who could not be treated as an enemy. On the contrary as a family there was a duty to swallow any revulsion for him and to be patient just to be patient

Because of his injuries Gregor had lost much of his mobility probably permanently He had been reduced to the condition of an ancient invalid and it took him long long minutes to crawl across his room crawling over the ceiling was out of the question but this deterioration in his condition was fully in his opinion made up for by the door to the living room being left open every evening He got into the habit of closely watching it for one or two hours before it was opened and then lying in the darkness of his room where he could not be seen from the living room he could watch the family in the light of the dinner table and listen to their conversation with everyones permission in a way and thus quite differently from before

They no longer held the lively conversations of earlier times of course the ones that Gregor always thought about with longing when he was tired and getting into the damp bed in some small hotel room All of them were usually very quiet nowadays. Soon after dinner his father would go to sleep in his chair his mother and sister would urge each other to be quiet his mother bent deeply under the lamp would sew fancy underwear for a fashion shop his sister who had taken a sales job learned shorthand and French in the evenings so that she might be able to get a better position later on Sometimes his father would wake up and say to Gregors mother youre doing so much sewing again today as if he did not know that he had been dozing and then he would go back to sleep again while mother and sister would exchange a tired grin

With a kind of stubbornness Gregors father refused to take his uniform off even at home while his nightgown hung unused on its peg Gregors father would slumber where he was fully dressed as if always ready to serve and expecting to hear the voice of his superior even here The uniform had not been new to start with but as a result of this it slowly became even shabbier despite the efforts of Gregors mother and sister to look after it Gregor would often spend the whole evening looking at all the stains on this coat with its gold buttons always kept polished and shiny

while the old man in it would sleep highly uncomfortable but peaceful

As soon as it struck ten Gregors mother would speak gently to his father to wake him and try to persuade him to go to bed as he couldnt sleep properly where he was and he really had to get his sleep if he was to be up at six to get to work But since he had been in work he had become more obstinate and would always insist on staying longer at the table even though he regularly fell asleep and it was then harder than ever to persuade him to exchange the chair for his bed Then however much mother and sister would importune him with little reproaches and warnings he would keep slowly shaking his head for a quarter of an hour with his eyes closed and refusing to get up Gregors mother would tug at his sleeve whisper endearments into his ear Gregors sister would leave her work to help her mother but nothing would have any effect on him He would just sink deeper into his chair Only when the two women took him under the arms he would abruptly open his eyes look at them one after the other and say What a life This is what peace I get in my old age And supported by the two women he would lift himself up carefully as if he were carrying the greatest load himself let the women take him to the door send them off and carry on by himself while Gregors mother would throw down her needle and his sister her pen so that they could run after his father and continue being of help to him

Who in this tired and overworked family would have had time to give more attention to Gregor than was absolutely necessary The household budget became even smaller so now the maid was dismissed an enormous thickboned charwoman with white hair that flapped around her head came every morning and evening to do the heaviest work everything else was looked after by Gregors mother on top of the large amount of sewing work she did Gregor even learned listening to the evening conversation about what price they had hoped for that several items of jewellery belonging to the family had been sold even though both mother and sister had been very fond of wearing them at functions and celebrations But the loudest complaint was that although the flat was much too big for their present circumstances they could not move out of it there was no imaginable way of transferring Gregor to the new address He could see quite well though that there were more reasons than consideration for him that made it difficult for them to move it would have been quite easy to transport him in any suitable crate with a few air holes in it the main thing holding the family back from their decision to move was much more to do with their total despair and the thought that they had been struck with a misfortune unlike anything experienced by anyone else they knew or were related to They carried out absolutely everything that the world expects from poor people Gregors father brought bank employees their breakfast his mother sacrificed herself by washing clothes for strangers his sister ran back and forth behind her desk at the behest of the customers but they just did not have the strength to do any more And the injury in Gregors back began to hurt as much as when it was new After they had come back from taking his father to bed Gregors mother and sister would now leave their work where it was and sit close together cheek to cheek his mother would point to Gregors room and say Close that door Grete and then when he was in the dark again they would sit in the next room and their tears would mingle or they would simply sit there staring dryeyed at the table

Gregor hardly slept at all either night or day Sometimes he would think of taking over the familys affairs just like before the next time the door was opened he had long forgotten about his boss

and the chief clerk but they would appear again in his thoughts the salesmen and the apprentices that stupid teaboy two or three friends from other businesses one of the chambermaids from a provincial hotel a tender memory that appeared and disappeared again a cashier from a hat shop for whom his attention had been serious but too slow all of them appeared to him mixed together with strangers and others he had forgotten but instead of helping him and his family they were all of them inaccessible and he was glad when they disappeared Other times he was not at all in the mood to look after his family he was filled with simple rage about the lack of attention he was shown and although he could think of nothing he would have wanted he made plans of how he could get into the pantry where he could take all the things he was entitled to even if he was not hungry Gregors sister no longer thought about how she could please him but would hurriedly push some food or other into his room with her foot before she rushed out to work in the morning and at midday and in the evening she would sweep it away again with the broom indifferent as to whether it had been eaten or more often than not had been left totally untouched She still cleared up the room in the evening but now she could not have been any quicker about it Smears of dirt were left on the walls here and there were little balls of dust and filth At first Gregor went into one of the worst of these places when his sister arrived as a reproach to her but he could have stayed there for weeks without his sister doing anything about it she could see the dirt as well as he could but she had simply decided to leave him to it At the same time she became touchy in a way that was quite new for her and which everyone in the family understood cleaning up Gregors room was for her and her alone Gregors mother did once thoroughly clean his room and needed to use several bucketfuls of water to do it although that much dampness also made Gregor ill and he lay flat on the couch bitter and immobile But his mother was to be punished still more for what she had done as hardly had his sister arrived home in the evening than she noticed the change in Gregors room and highly aggrieved ran back into the living room where despite her mothers raised and imploring hands she broke into convulsive tears Her father of course was startled out of his chair and the two parents looked on astonished and helpless then they too became agitated Gregors father standing to the right of his mother accused her of not leaving the cleaning of Gregors room to his sister from her left Gregors sister screamed at her that she was never to clean Gregors room again while his mother tried to draw his father who was beside himself with anger into the bedroom his sister quaking with tears thumped on the table with her small fists and Gregor hissed in anger that noone had even thought of closing the door to save him the sight of this and all its noise

Gregors sister was exhausted from going out to work and looking after Gregor as she had done before was even more work for her but even so his mother ought certainly not to have taken her place Gregor on the other hand ought not to be neglected Now though the charwoman was here This elderly widow with a robust bone structure that made her able to withstand the hardest of things in her long life wasnt really repelled by Gregor Just by chance one day rather than any real curiosity she opened the door to Gregors room and found herself face to face with him He was taken totally by surprise noone was chasing him but he began to rush to and fro while she just stood there in amazement with her hands crossed in front of her From then on she never failed to open the door slightly every evening and morning and look briefly in on him At first she would call to him as she did so with words that she probably considered friendly such as come on then you old dungbeetle or look at the old dungbeetle there Gregor never

responded to being spoken to in that way but just remained where he was without moving as if the door had never even been opened. If only they had told this charwoman to clean up his room every day instead of letting her disturb him for no reason whenever she felt like it One day early in the morning while a heavy rain struck the windowpanes perhaps indicating that spring was coming she began to speak to him in that way once again. Gregor was so resentful of it that he started to move toward her he was slow and infirm but it was like a kind of attack. Instead of being afraid the charwoman just lifted up one of the chairs from near the door and stood there with her mouth open clearly intending not to close her mouth until the chair in her hand had been slammed down into Gregors back. Arent you coming any closer then she asked when Gregor turned round again and she calmly put the chair back in the corner.

Gregor had almost entirely stopped eating Only if he happened to find himself next to the food that had been prepared for him he might take some of it into his mouth to play with it leave it there a few hours and then more often than not spit it out again At first he thought it was distress at the state of his room that stopped him eating but he had soon got used to the changes made there They had got into the habit of putting things into this room that they had no room for anywhere else and there were now many such things as one of the rooms in the flat had been rented out to three gentlemen These earnest gentlemen all three of them had full beards as Gregor learned peering through the crack in the door one day were painfully insistent on things being tidy This meant not only in their own room but since they had taken a room in this establishment in the entire flat and especially in the kitchen Unnecessary clutter was something they could not tolerate especially if it was dirty They had moreover brought most of their own furnishings and equipment with them For this reason many things had become superfluous which although they could not be sold the family did not wish to discard All these things found their way into Gregors room The dustbins from the kitchen found their way in there too The charwoman was always in a hurry and anything she couldnt use for the time being she would just chuck in there He fortunately would usually see no more than the object and the hand that held it The woman most likely meant to fetch the things back out again when she had time and the opportunity or to throw everything out in one go but what actually happened was that they were left where they landed when they had first been thrown unless Gregor made his way through the junk and moved it somewhere else At first he moved it because with no other room free where he could crawl about he was forced to but later on he came to enjoy it although moving about in that way left him sad and tired to death and he would remain immobile for hours afterwards

The gentlemen who rented the room would sometimes take their evening meal at home in the living room that was used by everyone and so the door to this room was often kept closed in the evening But Gregor found it easy to give up having the door open he had after all often failed to make use of it when it was open and without the family having noticed it lain in his room in its darkest corner One time though the charwoman left the door to the living room slightly open and it remained open when the gentlemen who rented the room came in in the evening and the light was put on They sat up at the table where formerly Gregor had taken his meals with his father and mother they unfolded the serviettes and picked up their knives and forks Gregors mother immediately appeared in the doorway with a dish of meat and soon behind her came his sister with a dish piled high with potatoes The food was steaming and filled the room with its smell The gentlemen bent over the dishes set in front of them as if they wanted to test the food before

eating it and the gentleman in the middle who seemed to count as an authority for the other two did indeed cut off a piece of meat while it was still in its dish clearly wishing to establish whether it was sufficiently cooked or whether it should be sent back to the kitchen It was to his satisfaction and Gregors mother and sister who had been looking on anxiously began to breathe again and smiled

The family themselves ate in the kitchen Nonetheless Gregors father came into the living room before he went into the kitchen bowed once with his cap in his hand and did his round of the table The gentlemen stood as one and mumbled something into their beards Then once they were alone they ate in near perfect silence It seemed remarkable to Gregor that above all the various noises of eating their chewing teeth could still be heard as if they had wanted to show Gregor that you need teeth in order to eat and it was not possible to perform anything with jaws that are toothless however nice they might be Id like to eat something said Gregor anxiously but not anything like theyre eating They do feed themselves And here I am dying

Throughout all this time Gregor could not remember having heard the violin being played but this evening it began to be heard from the kitchen The three gentlemen had already finished their meal the one in the middle had produced a newspaper given a page to each of the others and now they leant back in their chairs reading them and smoking When the violin began playing they became attentive stood up and went on tiptoe over to the door of the hallway where they stood pressed against each other Someone must have heard them in the kitchen as Gregors father called out Is the playing perhaps unpleasant for the gentlemen We can stop it straight away On the contrary said the middle gentleman would the young lady not like to come in and play for us here in the room where it is after all much more cosy and comfortable Oh yes wed love to called back Gregors father as if he had been the violin player himself The gentlemen stepped back into the room and waited Gregors father soon appeared with the music stand his mother with the music and his sister with the violin She calmly prepared everything for her to begin playing his parents who had never rented a room out before and therefore showed an exaggerated courtesy towards the three gentlemen did not even dare to sit on their own chairs his father leant against the door with his right hand pushed in between two buttons on his uniform coat his mother though was offered a seat by one of the gentlemen and sat leaving the chair where the gentleman happened to have placed it out of the way in a corner

His sister began to play father and mother paid close attention one on each side to the movements of her hands. Drawn in by the playing Gregor had dared to come forward a little and already had his head in the living room. Before he had taken great pride in how considerate he was but now it hardly occurred to him that he had become so thoughtless about the others. Whats more there was now all the more reason to keep himself hidden as he was covered in the dust that lay everywhere in his room and flew up at the slightest movement he carried threads hairs and remains of food about on his back and sides he was much too indifferent to everything now to lay on his back and wipe himself on the carpet like he had used to do several times a day. And despite this condition he was not too shy to move forward a little onto the immaculate floor of the living room.

Noone noticed him though The family was totally preoccupied with the violin playing at first the three gentlemen had put their

stand to look at all the notes being played and they must have disturbed Gregors sister but soon in contrast with the family they withdrew back to the window with their heads sunk and talking to each other at half volume and they stayed by the window while Gregors father observed them anxiously It really now seemed very obvious that they had expected to hear some beautiful or entertaining violin playing but had been disappointed that they had had enough of the whole performance and it was only now out of politeness that they allowed their peace to be disturbed It was especially unnerving the way they all blew the smoke from their cigarettes upwards from their mouth and noses Yet Gregors sister was playing so beautifully Her face was leant to one side following the lines of music with a careful and melancholy expression Gregor crawled a little further forward keeping his head close to the ground so that he could meet her eyes if the chance came Was he an animal if music could captivate him so It seemed to him that he was being shown the way to the unknown nourishment he had been yearning for He was determined to make his way forward to his sister and tug at her skirt to show her she might come into his room with her violin as noone appreciated her playing here as much as he would He never wanted to let her out of his room not while he lived anyway his shocking appearance should for once be of some use to him he wanted to be at every door of his room at once to hiss and spit at the attackers his sister should not be forced to stay with him though but stay of her own free will she would sit beside him on the couch with her ear bent down to him while he told her how he had always intended to send her to the conservatory how he would have told everyone about it last Christmas had Christmas really come and gone already if this misfortune hadnt got in the way and refuse to let anyone dissuade him from it On hearing all this his sister would break out in tears of emotion and Gregor would climb up to her shoulder and kiss her neck which since she had been going out to work she had kept free without any necklace or collar

hands in their pockets and come up far too close behind the music

Mr Samsa shouted the middle gentleman to Gregors father pointing without wasting any more words with his forefinger at Gregor as he slowly moved forward The violin went silent the middle of the three gentlemen first smiled at his two friends shaking his head and then looked back at Gregor His father seemed to think it more important to calm the three gentlemen before driving Gregor out even though they were not at all upset and seemed to think Gregor was more entertaining than the violin playing had been He rushed up to them with his arms spread out and attempted to drive them back into their room at the same time as trying to block their view of Gregor with his body Now they did become a little annoyed and it was not clear whether it was his fathers behaviour that annoyed them or the dawning realisation that they had had a neighbour like Gregor in the next room without knowing it They asked Gregors father for explanations raised their arms like he had tugged excitedly at their beards and moved back towards their room only very slowly Meanwhile Gregors sister had overcome the despair she had fallen into when her playing was suddenly interrupted She had let her hands drop and let violin and bow hang limply for a while but continued to look at the music as if still playing but then she suddenly pulled herself together lay the instrument on her mothers lap who still sat laboriously struggling for breath where she was and ran into the next room which under pressure from her father the three gentlemen were more quickly moving toward Under his sisters experienced hand the pillows and covers on the beds flew up and were put into order and she had already finished making the beds and slipped out again before the three gentlemen had reached the room Gregors father

seemed so obsessed with what he was doing that he forgot all the respect he owed to his tenants He urged them and pressed them until when he was already at the door of the room the middle of the three gentlemen shouted like thunder and stamped his foot and thereby brought Gregors father to a halt I declare here and now he said raising his hand and glancing at Gregors mother and sister to gain their attention too that with regard to the repugnant conditions that prevail in this flat and with this family here he looked briefly but decisively at the floor I give immediate notice on my room For the days that I have been living here I will of course pay nothing at all on the contrary I will consider whether to proceed with some kind of action for damages from you and believe me it would be very easy to set out the grounds for such an action He was silent and looked straight ahead as if waiting for something And indeed his two friends joined in with the words And we also give immediate notice With that he took hold of the door handle and slammed the door

Father Mother said his sister hitting the table with her hand as introduction we cant carry on like this Maybe you cant see it but I can I dont want to call this monster my brother all I can say is we have to try and get rid of it Weve done all thats humanly possible to look after it and be patient I dont think anyone could accuse us of doing anything wrong

Shes absolutely right said Gregors father to himself His mother who still had not had time to catch her breath began to cough dully her hand held out in front of her and a deranged expression in her eyes

Gregors sister rushed to his mother and put her hand on her forehead Her words seemed to give Gregors father some more definite ideas He sat upright played with his uniform cap between the plates left by the three gentlemen after their meal and occasionally looked down at Gregor as he lay there immobile

We have to try and get rid of it said Gregors sister now speaking only to her father as her mother was too occupied with coughing to listen itll be the death of both of you I can see it coming We cant all work as hard as we have to and then come home to be tortured like this we cant endure it I cant endure it any more And she broke out so heavily in tears that they flowed down the face of her mother and she wiped them away with mechanical hand movements

My child said her father with sympathy and obvious understanding what are we to do  $\,$ 

His sister just shrugged her shoulders as a sign of the helplessness and tears that had taken hold of her displacing her earlier certainty

If he could just understand us said his father almost as a question his sister shook her hand vigorously through her tears as a sign that of that there was no question

If he could just understand us repeated Gregors father closing his eyes in acceptance of his sisters certainty that that was quite impossible then perhaps we could come to some kind of arrangement with him But as it is

Its got to go shouted his sister thats the only way Father Youve got to get rid of the idea that thats Gregor Weve only harmed ourselves by believing it for so long How can that be Gregor If it were Gregor he would have seen long ago that its not possible for human beings to live with an animal like that and he would have gone of his own free will We wouldnt have a brother any more then but we could carry on with our lives and remember him with respect As it is this animal is persecuting us its driven out our tenants it obviously wants to take over the whole flat and force us to sleep on the streets Father look just look she suddenly screamed hes starting again In her alarm which was totally beyond Gregors comprehension his sister even abandoned his mother as she pushed herself vigorously out of her chair as if more willing to sacrifice her own mother than stay anywhere near Gregor She rushed over to behind her father who had become excited merely because she was and stood up half raising his hands in front of Gregors sister as if to protect her

But Gregor had had no intention of frightening anyone least of all his sister All he had done was begin to turn round so that he could go back into his room although that was in itself quite startling as his painwracked condition meant that turning round required a great deal of effort and he was using his head to help himself do it repeatedly raising it and striking it against the floor He stopped and looked round They seemed to have realised his good intention and had only been alarmed briefly Now they all looked at him in unhappy silence His mother lay in her chair with her legs stretched out and pressed against each other her eyes nearly closed with exhaustion his sister sat next to his father with her arms around his neck

Maybe now theyll let me turn round thought Gregor and went back to work He could not help panting loudly with the effort and had sometimes to stop and take a rest Noone was making him rush any more everything was left up to him. As soon as he had finally finished turning round he began to move straight ahead. He was amazed at the great distance that separated him from his room and could not understand how he had covered that distance in his weak state a little while before and almost without noticing it. He concentrated on crawling as fast as he could and hardly noticed that there was not a word not any cry from his family to distract him. He did not turn his head until he had reached the doorway. He did not turn it all the way round as he felt his neck becoming stiff but it was nonetheless enough to see that nothing behind him had changed only his sister had stood up. With his last glance he saw that his mother had now fallen completely asleep

He was hardly inside his room before the door was hurriedly shut bolted and locked The sudden noise behind Gregor so startled him that his little legs collapsed under him It was his sister who had been in so much of a rush She had been standing there waiting and sprung forward lightly Gregor had not heard her coming at all and as she turned the key in the lock she said loudly to her parents At last

What now then Gregor asked himself as he looked round in the darkness He soon made the discovery that he could no longer move at all This was no surprise to him it seemed rather that being able to actually move around on those spindly little legs until then was unnatural He also felt relatively comfortable It is true that his entire body was aching but the pain seemed to be slowly getting weaker and weaker and would finally disappear altogether He could already hardly feel the decayed apple in his back or the inflamed area around it which was entirely covered in white dust He thought back of his family with emotion and love If it was possible he felt that he must go away even more strongly than his sister He remained in this state of empty and peaceful rumination until he heard the clock tower strike three in the morning He watched as it slowly began to get light everywhere outside the window too Then without his willing it his head sank down completely and his last breath flowed weakly from his nostrils

When the cleaner came in early in the morning theyd often asked her not to keep slamming the doors but with her strength and in her hurry she still did so that everyone in the flat knew when shed arrived and from then on it was impossible to sleep in peace she made her usual brief look in on Gregor and at first found nothing special She thought he was laying there so still on purpose playing the martyr she attributed all possible understanding to him She happened to be holding the long broom in her hand so she tried to tickle Gregor with it from the doorway When she had no success with that she tried to make a nuisance of herself and poked at him a little and only when she found she could shove him across the floor with no resistance at all did she start to pay attention She soon realised what had really happened opened her eyes wide whistled to herself but did not waste time to yank open the bedroom doors and shout loudly into the darkness of the bedrooms Come and ave a look at this its dead just lying there stone dead

Mr and Mrs Samsa sat upright there in their marriage bed and had to make an effort to get over the shock caused by the cleaner before they could grasp what she was saying But then each from his own side they hurried out of bed Mr Samsa threw the blanket over his shoulders Mrs Samsa just came out in her nightdress and that is how they went into Gregors room On the way they opened the door to the living room where Grete had been sleeping since the three gentlemen had moved in she was fully dressed as if she had never been asleep and the paleness of her face seemed to confirm this Dead asked Mrs Samsa looking at the charwoman enquiringly even though she could have checked for herself and could have known it even without checking Thats what I said replied the cleaner and to prove it she gave Gregors body another shove with the broom sending it sideways across the floor Mrs Samsa made a movement as if she wanted to hold back the broom but did not complete it Now then said Mr Samsa lets give thanks to God for that He crossed himself and the three women followed his example Grete who had not taken her eyes from the corpse said Just look how thin he was He didnt eat anything for so long The food came out again just the same as when it went in Gregors body was indeed completely dried up and flat they had not seen it until then but now he was not lifted up on his little legs nor did he do anything to make them look away

Grete come with us in here for a little while said Mrs Samsa with a pained smile and Grete followed her parents into the bedroom but not without looking back at the body. The cleaner shut the door and opened the window wide. Although it was still early in the morning the fresh air had something of warmth mixed in with it. It was already the end of March after all

The three gentlemen stepped out of their room and looked round in amazement for their breakfasts they had been forgotten about Where is our breakfast the middle gentleman asked the cleaner irritably She just put her finger on her lips and made a quick and silent sign to the men that they might like to come into Gregors room They did so and stood around Gregors corpse with their hands in the pockets of their wellworn coats It was now quite light in the room

Then the door of the bedroom opened and Mr Samsa appeared in his uniform with his wife on one arm and his daughter on the other All of them had been crying a little Grete now and then pressed her face against her fathers arm

Leave my home Now said Mr Samsa indicating the door and without letting the women from him What do you mean asked the middle of the three gentlemen somewhat disconcerted and he smiled sweetly The other two held their hands behind their backs and continually rubbed them together in gleeful anticipation of a loud quarrel which could only end in their favour I mean just what I said answered Mr Samsa and with his two companions went in a straight line towards the man At first he stood there still looking at the ground as if the contents of his head were rearranging themselves into new positions Alright well go then he said and looked up at Mr Samsa as if he had been suddenly overcome with humility and wanted permission again from Mr Samsa for his decision Mr Samsa merely opened his eyes wide and briefly nodded to him several times At that and without delay the man actually did take long strides into the front hallway his two friends had stopped rubbing their hands some time before and had been listening to what was being said Now they jumped off after their friend as if taken with a sudden fear that Mr Samsa might go into the hallway in front of them and break the connection with their leader Once there all three took their hats from the stand took their sticks from the holder bowed without a word and left the premises Mr Samsa and the two women followed them out onto the landing but they had had no reason to mistrust the mens intentions and as they leaned over the landing they saw how the three gentlemen made slow but steady progress down the many steps As they turned the corner on each floor they disappeared and would reappear a few moments later the further down they went the more that the Samsa family lost interest in them when a butchers boy proud of posture with his tray on his head passed them on his way up and came nearer than they were Mr Samsa and the women came away from the landing and went as if relieved back into the flat

They decided the best way to make use of that day was for relaxation and to go for a walk not only had they earned a break from work but they were in serious need of it So they sat at the table and wrote three letters of excusal Mr Samsa to his employers Mrs Samsa to her contractor and Grete to her principal The cleaner came in while they were writing to tell them she was going shed finished her work for that morning The three of them at first just nodded without looking up from what they were writing and it was only when the cleaner still did not seem to want to leave that they looked up in irritation Well asked Mr Samsa The charwoman stood in the doorway with a smile on her face as if she had some tremendous good news to report but would only do it if she was clearly asked to The almost vertical little ostrich feather on her hat which had been a source of irritation to Mr Samsa all the time she had been working for them swayed gently in all directions What is it you want then asked Mrs Samsa whom the cleaner had the most respect for Yes she answered and broke into a friendly laugh

that made her unable to speak straight away well then that thing in there you neednt worry about how youre going to get rid of it Thats all been sorted out Mrs Samsa and Grete bent down over their letters as if intent on continuing with what they were writing Mr Samsa saw that the cleaner wanted to start describing everything in detail but with outstretched hand he made it quite clear that she was not to So as she was prevented from telling them all about it she suddenly remembered what a hurry she was in and clearly peeved called out Cheerio then everyone turned round sharply and left slamming the door terribly as she went

Tonight she gets sacked said Mr Samsa but he received no reply from either his wife or his daughter as the charwoman seemed to have destroyed the peace they had only just gained. They got up and went over to the window where they remained with their arms around each other. Mr Samsa twisted round in his chair to look at them and sat there watching for a while. Then he called out Come here then Lets forget about all that old stuff shall we. Come and give me a bit of attention. The two women immediately did as he said hurrying over to him where they kissed him and hugged him and then they quickly finished their letters.

After that the three of them left the flat together which was something they had not done for months and took the tram out to the open country outside the town They had the tram filled with warm sunshine all to themselves Leant back comfortably on their seats they discussed their prospects and found that on closer examination they were not at all bad until then they had never asked each other about their work but all three had jobs which were very good and held particularly good promise for the future The greatest improvement for the time being of course would be achieved quite easily by moving house what they needed now was a flat that was smaller and cheaper than the current one which had been chosen by Gregor one that was in a better location and most of all more practical All the time Grete was becoming livelier With all the worry they had been having of late her cheeks had become pale but while they were talking Mr and Mrs Samsa were struck almost simultaneously with the thought of how their daughter was blossoming into a well built and beautiful young lady They became quieter Just from each others glance and almost without knowing it they agreed that it would soon be time to find a good man for her And as if in confirmation of their new dreams and good intentions as soon as they reached their destination Grete was the first to get up and stretch out her young body

['\nOne morning when Gregor Samsa woke from troubled dreams he found\nhimself transf ormed in his bed into a horrible vermin He lay on\nhis armourlike back and if he li fted his head a little he could\nsee his brown belly slightly domed and divided by a rches into stiff\nsections The bedding was hardly able to cover it and seemed ready \nto slide off any moment His many legs pitifully thin compared\nwith the size of t he rest of him waved about helplessly as he\nlooked\n\nWhats happened to me he thoug ht It wasnt a dream His room\na proper human room although a little too small lay peacefully\nbetween its four familiar walls A collection of textile samples\nlay sp read out on the table Samsa was a travelling salesman and\nabove it there hung a p icture that he had recently cut out of an\nillustrated magazine and housed in a nice gilded frame It showed\na lady fitted out with a fur hat and fur boa who sat uprigh t\nraising a heavy fur muff that covered the whole of her lower arm\ntowards the vie wer\n\nGregor then turned to look out the window at the dull weather\nDrops of rain could be heard hitting the pane which made him feel\nquite sad How about if I sleep a little bit longer and forget all\nthis nonsense he thought but that was something he was unable to\ndo because he was used to sleeping on his right and in his present \nstate couldnt get into that position However hard he threw\nhimself onto his righ t he always rolled back to where he was He\nmust have tried it a hundred times shut his eyes so that he\nwouldnt have to look at the floundering legs and only stopped w hen\nhe began to feel a mild dull pain there that he had never felt\nbefore\n\nOh Go d he thought what a strenuous career it is that Ive\nchosen Travelling day in and da y out Doing business like this\ntakes much more effort than doing your own business at home and on\ntop of that theres the curse of travelling worries about making\ntra in connections bad and irregular food contact with different\npeople all the time so that you can never get to know anyone or\nbecome friendly with them It can all go t o Hell He felt a\nslight itch up on his belly pushed himself slowly up on his back \ntowards the headboard so that he could lift his head better found\nwhere the itch was and saw that it was covered with lots of little\nwhite spots which he didnt know what to make of and when he tried\nto feel the place with one of his legs he drew it quickly back\nbecause as soon as he touched it he was overcome by a cold shudder\n\n He slid back into his former position Getting up early all the\ntime he thought it makes you stupid Youve got to get enough\nsleep Other travelling salesmen live a 1 ife of luxury For\ninstance whenever I go back to the guest house during the mornin

g\nto copy out the contract these gentlemen are always still sitting\nthere eating t heir breakfasts I ought to just try that with my\nboss Id get kicked out on the spo t But who knows maybe that\nwould be the best thing for me If I didnt have my pare nts to\nthink about Id have given in my notice a long time ago Id have\ngone up to t he boss and told him just what I think tell him\neverything I would let him know jus t what I feel Hed fall right\noff his desk And its a funny sort of business to be s itting up\nthere at your desk talking down at your subordinates from up there\nespec ially when you have to go right up close because the boss is\nhard of hearing Well theres still some hope once Ive got the\nmoney together to pay off my parents debt t o him another five or\nsix years I suppose thats definitely what Ill do Thats whe n\nIll make the big change First of all though Ive got to get up\nmy train leaves a t five\n\nAnd he looked over at the alarm clock ticking on the chest of\ndrawers Go d in Heaven he thought It was half past six and the\nhands were quietly moving forw ards it was even later than half\npast more like quarter to seven Had the alarm clo ck not rung He\ncould see from the bed that it had been set for four oclock as it\ns hould have been it certainly must have rung Yes but was it\npossible to quietly sle ep through that furniturerattling noise\nTrue he had not slept peacefully but probab ly all the more deeply\nbecause of that What should he do now The next train went a t\nseven if he were to catch that he would have to rush like mad and\nthe collection of samples was still not packed and he did not at\nall feel particularly fresh and l ively And even if he did catch\nthe train he would not avoid his bosss anger as the office\nassistant would have been there to see the five oclock train go he\nwould ha ve put in his report about Gregors not being there a long\ntime ago The office assi stant was the bosss man spineless and\nwith no understanding What about if he repor ted sick But that\nwould be extremely strained and suspicious as in fifteen years of \nservice Gregor had never once yet been ill His boss would\ncertainly come round w ith the doctor from the medical insurance\ncompany accuse his parents of having a la zy son and accept the\ndoctors recommendation not to make any claim as the doctor be lieved\nthat noone was ever ill but that many were workshy And whats\nmore would he have been entirely wrong in this case Gregor did in\nfact apart from excessive sleep iness after sleeping for so long\nfeel completely well and even felt much hungrier t han usual\n\nHe was still hurriedly thinking all this through unable to decide\nto g et out of the bed when the clock struck quarter to seven\nThere was a cautious knock at the door near his head Gregor\nsomebody called it was his mother its quarter t o seven\nDidnt you want to go somewhere That gentle voice Gregor was\nshocked when he heard his own voice answering it could hardly be\nrecognised as the voice he had had before As if from deep inside\nhim there was a painful and uncontrollable squea king mixed in with\nit the words could be made out at first but then there was a sor t\nof echo which made them unclear leaving the hearer unsure whether\nhe had heard p roperly or not Gregor had wanted to give a full\nanswer and explain everything but in the circumstances contented\nhimself with saying Yes mother yes thankyou Im getti ng up\nnow The change in Gregors voice probably could not be noticed\noutside throu gh the wooden door as his mother was satisfied with\nthis explanation and shuffled a way But this short conversation\nmade the other members of the family aware that Gr egor against\ntheir expectations was still at home and soon his father came\nknockin g at one of the side doors gently but with his fist\nGregor Gregor he called whats w rong And after a short\nwhile he called again with a warning deepness in his voice Gregor\nGregor At the other side door his sister came plaintively\nGregor Arent you well Do you need anything Gregor answered to\nboth sides Im ready now making an eff ort to remove all the\nstrangeness from his voice by enunciating very carefully and putting\nlong pauses between each individual word His father went back to\nhis brea kfast but his sister whispered Gregor open the door I\nbeg of you Gregor however ha d no thought of opening the door\nand instead congratulated himself for his cautious habit acquired\nfrom his travelling of locking all doors at night even when he was\n at home\n\nThe first thing he wanted to do was to get up in peace without being\ndis turbed to get dressed and most of all to have his breakfast\nOnly then would he cons ider what to do next as he was well aware\nthat he would not bring his thoughts to a ny sensible conclusions by\nlying in bed He remembered that he had often felt a sli ght pain in\nbed perhaps caused by lying awkwardly but that had always turned\nout t o be pure imagination and he wondered how his imaginings would\nslowly resolve thems elves today He did not have the slightest\ndoubt that the change in his voice was n othing more than the first\nsign of a serious cold which was an occupational hazard for\ntravelling salesmen\n\nIt was a simple matter to throw off the covers he only h ad to blow\nhimself up a little and they fell off by themselves But it became\ndiff

icult after that especially as he was so exceptionally broad\nHe would have used his arms and his hands to push himself up but\ninstead of them he only had all those lit tle legs continuously\nmoving in different directions and which he was moreover unab le to\ncontrol If he wanted to bend one of them then that was the first\none that w ould stretch itself out and if he finally managed to do\nwhat he wanted with that le g all the others seemed to be set free\nand would move about painfully This is some thing that cant be\ndone in bed Gregor said to himself so dont keep trying to do\nit \n\nThe first thing he wanted to do was get the lower part of his body\nout of the b ed but he had never seen this lower part and could not\nimagine what it looked like it turned out to be too hard to move\nit went so slowly and finally almost in a fren zy when he\ncarelessly shoved himself forwards with all the force he could\ngather h e chose the wrong direction hit hard against the lower\nbedpost and learned from the burning pain he felt that the lower\npart of his body might well at present be the m ost sensitive\n\nSo then he tried to get the top part of his body out of the bed\nfi rst carefully turning his head to the side This he managed\nquite easily and despit e its breadth and its weight the bulk of\nhis body eventually followed slowly in the direction of the head\nBut when he had at last got his head out of the bed and into the\nfresh air it occurred to him that if he let himself fall it would be\na miracle if his head were not injured so he became afraid to carry\non pushing himself forwar d the same way And he could not knock\nhimself out now at any price better to stay in bed than lose\nconsciousness\n\nIt took just as much effort to get back to where he had been\nearlier but when he lay there sighing and was once more watching\nhis l egs as they struggled against each other even harder than\nbefore if that was possib le he could think of no way of bringing\npeace and order to this chaos He told hims elf once more that it\nwas not possible for him to stay in bed and that the most sen sible\nthing to do would be to get free of it in whatever way he could at\nwhatever sacrifice At the same time though he did not forget to\nremind himself that calm co nsideration was much better than rushing\nto desperate conclusions. At times like th is he would direct his\neyes to the window and look out as clearly as he could but\n unfortunately even the other side of the narrow street was\nenveloped in morning fog and the view had little confidence or cheer\nto offer him Seven oclock already he s aid to himself when the \nclock struck again seven oclock and theres still a fog like \nthis And he lay there quietly a while longer breathing lightly\nas if he perhaps expected the total stillness to bring things back\nto their real and natural state\n \nBut then he said to himself Before it strikes quarter past seven\nIll definitely h ave to have got properly out of bed And by then\nsomebody will have come round from work to ask whats happened to me\nas well as they open up at work before seven ocloc k And so he\nset himself to the task of swinging the entire length of his body\nout of the bed all at the same time If he succeeded in falling out\nof bed in this way and kept his head raised as he did so he could\nprobably avoid injuring it His back seemed to be quite hard and\nprobably nothing would happen to it falling onto the ca rpet His\nmain concern was for the loud noise he was bound to make and which\neven through all the doors would probably raise concern if not\nalarm But it was somethi ng that had to be risked\n\nWhen Gregor was already sticking half way out of the bed the new\nmethod was more of a game than an effort all he had to do was rock\nback an d forth it occurred to him how simple everything would be\nif somebody came to help him Two strong people he had his father\nand the maid in mind would have been mor e than enough they would\nonly have to push their arms under the dome of his back pe el him\naway from the bed bend down with the load and then be patient and\ncareful a s he swang over onto the floor where hopefully the\nlittle legs would find a use Sh ould he really call for help\nthough even apart from the fact that all the doors wer e locked\nDespite all the difficulty he was in he could not suppress a smile\nat thi s thought\n\nAfter a while he had already moved so far across that it would have\nbe en hard for him to keep his balance if he rocked too hard The\ntime was now ten pas t seven and he would have to make a final\ndecision very soon Then there was a ring at the door of the flat\nThatll be someone from work he said to himself and froze ve ry\nstill although his little legs only became all the more lively as\nthey danced a round For a moment everything remained quiet\nTheyre not opening the door Gregor sa id to himself caught in\nsome nonsensical hope But then of course the maids firm st eps\nwent to the door as ever and opened it Gregor only needed to hear\nthe visitor s first words of greeting and he knew who it was the\nchief clerk himself Why did Gregor have to be the only one\ncondemned to work for a company where they immediate ly became highly\nsuspicious at the slightest shortcoming Were all employees every\n one of them louts was there not one of them who was faithful and\ndevoted who would

go so mad with pangs of conscience that he\ncouldnt get out of bed if he didnt spend at least a couple of\nhours in the morning on company business Was it really not eno ugh\nto let one of the trainees make enquiries assuming enquiries were\neven necess ary did the chief clerk have to come himself and did\nthey have to show the whole i nnocent family that this was so\nsuspicious that only the chief clerk could be trust ed to have the\nwisdom to investigate it And more because these thoughts had made\nh im upset than through any proper decision he swang himself with\nall his force out o f the bed There was a loud thump but it wasnt\nreally a loud noise His fall was so ftened a little by the carpet\nand Gregors back was also more elastic than he had th ought which\nmade the sound muffled and not too noticeable He had not held his\nhea d carefully enough though and hit it as he fell annoyed and in\npain he turned it an d rubbed it against the carpet\n\nSomethings fallen down in there said the chief cle rk in the room\non the left Gregor tried to imagine whether something of the sort\n that had happened to him today could ever happen to the chief clerk\ntoo you had to concede that it was possible But as if in gruff\nreply to this question the chief c lerks firm footsteps in his\nhighly polished boots could now be heard in the adjoini ng room\nFrom the room on his right Gregors sister whispered to him to let\nhim know Gregor the chief clerk is here Yes I know said\nGregor to himself but without darin g to raise his voice loud enough\nfor his sister to hear him\n\nGregor said his fath er now from the room to his left the chief\nclerk has come round and wants to know w hy you didnt leave on the\nearly train We dont know what to say to him And anyway he\nwants to speak to you personally So please open up this door Im\nsure hell be good enough to forgive the untidiness of your room\nThen the chief clerk called Good morning Mr Samsa He isnt\nwell said his mother to the chief clerk while his father \ncontinued to speak through the door He isnt well please believe\nme Why else wou ld Gregor have missed a train The lad only ever\nthinks about the business It nearl y makes me cross the way he\nnever goes out in the evenings hes been in town for a w eek now but\nstayed home every evening He sits with us in the kitchen and just\nrea ds the paper or studies train timetables His idea of relaxation\nis working with hi s fretsaw Hes made a little frame for\ninstance it only took him two or three eveni ngs youll be amazed\nhow nice it is its hanging up in his room youll see it as soon \nas Gregor opens the door Anyway Im glad youre here we wouldnt\nhave been able to get Gregor to open the door by ourselves hes so\nstubborn and Im sure he isnt well h e said this morning that he\nis but he isnt Ill be there in a moment said Gregor sl owly\nand thoughtfully but without moving so that he would not miss any\nword of the conversation Well I cant think of any other way of\nexplaining it Mrs Samsa said t he chief clerk I hope its\nnothing serious But on the other hand I must say that if we\npeople in commerce ever become slightly unwell then fortunately or\nunfortunatel y as you like we simply have to overcome it because of\nbusiness considerations Can the chief clerk come in to see you\nnow then asked his father impatiently knocking a t the door\nagain No said Gregor In the room on his right there followed\na painfu l silence in the room on his left his sister began to cry\n\nSo why did his sister n ot go and join the others She had probably\nonly just got up and had not even begun to get dressed And why was\nshe crying Was it because he had not got up and had not let the\nchief clerk in because he was in danger of losing his job and if\nthat happ ened his boss would once more pursue their parents with the\nsame demands as before There was no need to worry about things like\nthat yet Gregor was still there and h ad not the slightest\nintention of abandoning his family For the time being he just lay\nthere on the carpet and noone who knew the condition he was in\nwould seriously have expected him to let the chief clerk in It was\nonly a minor discourtesy and a suitable excuse could easily be\nfound for it later on it was not something for whic h Gregor could\nbe sacked on the spot And it seemed to Gregor much more sensible\nt o leave him now in peace instead of disturbing him with talking at\nhim and crying But the others didnt know what was happening they\nwere worried that would excuse th eir behaviour\n\nThe chief clerk now raised his voice Mr Samsa he called to him\nwha t is wrong You barricade yourself in your room give us no more\nthan yes or no for a n answer you are causing serious and\nunnecessary concern to your parents and you fa il and I mention\nthis just by the way you fail to carry out your business duties in\na way that is quite unheard of Im speaking here on behalf of your\nparents and of your employer and really must request a clear and\nimmediate explanation I am as tonished quite astonished I\nthought I knew you as a calm and sensible person and n ow you\nsuddenly seem to be showing off with peculiar whims This morning\nyour empl oyer did suggest a possible reason for your failure to\nappear its true it had to d o with the money that was recently\nentrusted to you but I came near to giving him

my word of honour\nthat that could not be the right explanation But now that I see \nyour incomprehensible stubbornness I no longer feel any wish\nwhatsoever to interc ede on your behalf And nor is your position\nall that secure I had originally inte nded to say all this to you\nin private but since you cause me to waste my time here for no good\nreason I dont see why your parents should not also learn of it\nYour tu rnover has been very unsatisfactory of late I grant you that\nits not the time of ye ar to do especially good business we\nrecognise that but there simply is no time of year to do no\nbusiness at all Mr Samsa we cannot allow there to be\n\nBut Sir call ed Gregor beside himself and forgetting all else in\nthe excitement Ill open up imme diately just a moment Im\nslightly unwell an attack of dizziness I havent been able to get\nup Im still in bed now Im quite fresh again now though Im\njust getting o ut of bed Just a moment Be patient Its not quite\nas easy as Id thought Im quite alright now though Its\nshocking what can suddenly happen to a person I was quite a lright\nlast night my parents know about it perhaps better than me I had\na small sy mptom of it last night already They must have noticed\nit I dont know why I didnt let you know at work But you always\nthink you can get over an illness without stayi ng at home Please\ndont make my parents suffer Theres no basis for any of the\naccu sations youre making nobodys ever said a word to me about any\nof these things Mayb e you havent read the latest contracts I sent\nin Ill set off with the eight oclock train as well these few\nhours of rest have given me strength You dont need to wait sir\nIll be in the office soon after you and please be so good as to\ntell that to t he boss and recommend me to him\n\nAnd while Gregor gushed out these words hardly kn owing what he was\nsaying he made his way over to the chest of drawers this was\nea sily done probably because of the practise he had already had in\nbed where he now tried to get himself upright He really did want\nto open the door really did want t o let them see him and to speak\nwith the chief clerk the others were being so insis tent and he was\ncurious to learn what they would say when they caught sight of him \nIf they were shocked then it would no longer be Gregors\nresponsibility and he cou ld rest If however they took everything\ncalmly he would still have no reason to be upset and if he hurried\nhe really could be at the station for eight oclock The fir st few\ntimes he tried to climb up on the smooth chest of drawers he just\nslid down again but he finally gave himself one last swing and\nstood there upright the lower part of his body was in serious pain\nbut he no longer gave any attention to it Now he let himself fall\nagainst the back of a nearby chair and held tightly to the edge s of\nit with his little legs By now he had also calmed down and kept\nquiet so tha t he could listen to what the chief clerk was saying\n\nDid you understand a word of all that the chief clerk asked his\nparents surely hes not trying to make fools of u s Oh God\ncalled his mother who was already in tears he could be seriously\nill and were making him suffer Grete Grete she then cried\nMother his sister called from th e other side They communicated\nacross Gregors room Youll have to go for the docto r straight\naway Gregor is ill Quick get the doctor Did you hear the way\nGregor spoke just now That was the voice of an animal said the \nchief clerk with a calmnes s that was in contrast with his mothers\nscreams Anna Anna his father called into t he kitchen through\nthe entrance hall clapping his hands get a locksmith here now\nA nd the two girls their skirts swishing immediately ran out\nthrough the hall wrenchi ng open the front door of the flat as they\nwent How had his sister managed to get dressed so quickly There\nwas no sound of the door banging shut again they must have left it\nopen people often do in homes where something awful has happened\n\nGregor in contrast had become much calmer So they couldnt\nunderstand his words any more a lthough they seemed clear enough to\nhim clearer than before perhaps his ears had b ecome used to the\nsound They had realised though that there was something wrong\nw ith him and were ready to help The first response to his\nsituation had been confid ent and wise and that made him feel\nbetter He felt that he had been drawn back in among people and\nfrom the doctor and the locksmith he expected great and surprising \nachievements although he did not really distinguish one from the\nother Whatever was said next would be crucial so in order to\nmake his voice as clear as possible h e coughed a little but taking\ncare to do this not too loudly as even this might wel 1 sound\ndifferent from the way that a human coughs and he was no longer sure\nhe co uld judge this for himself Meanwhile it had become very\nquiet in the next room Pe rhaps his parents were sat at the table\nwhispering with the chief clerk or perhaps they were all pressed\nagainst the door and listening\n\nGregor slowly pushed his wa y over to the door with the chair Once\nthere he let go of it and threw himself ont o the door holding\nhimself upright against it using the adhesive on the tips of his \nlegs He rested there a little while to recover from the effort\ninvolved and then

set himself to the task of turning the key in the\nlock with his mouth He seemed un fortunately to have no proper\nteeth how was he then to grasp the key but the lack of teeth\nwas of course made up for with a very strong jaw using the jaw\nhe really was able to start the key turning ignoring the fact that\nhe must have been causing some kind of damage as a brown fluid came\nfrom his mouth flowed over the key and dr ipped onto the floor\nListen said the chief clerk in the next room hes turning the\n key Gregor was greatly encouraged by this but they all should\nhave been calling to him his father and his mother too Well done\nGregor they should have cried keep at i t keep hold of the\nlock And with the idea that they were all excitedly following h is\nefforts he bit on the key with all his strength paying no\nattention to the pain he was causing himself As the key turned\nround he turned around the lock with it o nly holding himself\nupright with his mouth and hung onto the key or pushed it down \nagain with the whole weight of his body as needed The clear sound\nof the lock as it snapped back was Gregors sign that he could break\nhis concentration and as he re gained his breath he said to himself\nSo I didnt need the locksmith after all Then h e lay his head on\nthe handle of the door to open it completely\n\nBecause he had to open the door in this way it was already wide\nopen before he could be seen He had first to slowly turn himself\naround one of the double doors and he had to do it ver y carefully\nif he did not want to fall flat on his back before entering the\nroom He was still occupied with this difficult movement unable to\npay attention to anyth ing else when he heard the chief clerk\nexclaim a loud Oh which sounded like the sou ghing of the wind\nNow he also saw him he was the nearest to the door his hand\npr essed against his open mouth and slowly retreating as if driven by\na steady and inv isible force Gregors mother her hair still\ndishevelled from bed despite the chief clerks being there looked\nat his father Then she unfolded her arms took two steps forward\ntowards Gregor and sank down onto the floor into her skirts that\nspread th emselves out around her as her head disappeared down onto\nher breast His father lo oked hostile and clenched his fists as if\nwanting to knock Gregor back into his roo m Then he looked\nuncertainly round the living room covered his eyes with his hands \nand wept so that his powerful chest shook\n\nSo Gregor did not go into the room bu t leant against the inside of\nthe other door which was still held bolted in place In this way\nonly half of his body could be seen along with his head above it\nwhich he leant over to one side as he peered out at the others\nMeanwhile the day had beco me much lighter part of the endless\ngreyblack building on the other side of the str eet which was a\nhospital could be seen quite clearly with the austere and regular \nline of windows piercing its facade the rain was still\nfalling now throwing down large individual droplets which hit the\nground one at a time The washing up from b reakfast lay on the \ntable there was so much of it because for Gregors father \nbreak fast was the most important meal of the day and he would\nstretch it out for several hours as he sat reading a number of\ndifferent newspapers On the wall exactly oppos ite there was\nphotograph of Gregor when he was a lieutenant in the army his sword\n in his hand and a carefree smile on his face as he called forth\nrespect for his uni form and bearing The door to the entrance hall\nwas open and as the front door of t he flat was also open he could\nsee onto the landing and the stairs where they began their way down\nbelow\n\nNow then said Gregor well aware that he was the only one to \nhave kept calm Ill get dressed straight away now pack up my\nsamples and set off Will you please just let me leave You can\nsee he said to the chief clerk that Im no t stubborn and I\nlike to do my job being a commercial traveller is arduous but\nwit hout travelling I couldnt earn my living So where are you\ngoing in to the office Y es Will you report everything accurately\nthen Its quite possible for someone to be temporarily unable to\nwork but thats just the right time to remember whats been\nac hieved in the past and consider that later on once the difficulty\nhas been removed he will certainly work with all the more diligence\nand concentration Youre well aw are that Im seriously in debt to\nour employer as well as having to look after my pa rents and my\nsister so that Im trapped in a difficult situation but I will\nwork my way out of it again Please dont make things any harder\nfor me than they are alread y and dont take sides against me at the\noffice I know that nobody likes the travel lers They think we\nearn an enormous wage as well as having a soft time of it That s\njust prejudice but they have no particular reason to think better of\nit But you sir you have a better overview than the rest of the\nstaff in fact if I can say this in confidence a better overview\nthan the boss himself its very easy for a business man like him to\nmake mistakes about his employees and judge them more harshly than \nhe should And youre also well aware that we travellers spend\nalmost the whole ye ar away from the office so that we can very\neasily fall victim to gossip and chance

and groundless complaints\nand its almost impossible to defend yourself from that so rt of\nthing we dont usually even hear about them or if at all its when\nwe arrive b ack home exhausted from a trip and thats when we feel\nthe harmful effects of whats been going on without even knowing\nwhat caused them Please dont go away at least f irst say\nsomething to show that you grant that Im at least partly right\n\nBut the chief clerk had turned away as soon as Gregor had started to\nspeak and with protrud ing lips only stared back at him over his\ntrembling shoulders as he left He did no t keep still for a moment\nwhile Gregor was speaking but moved steadily towards the door\nwithout taking his eyes off him He moved very gradually as if\nthere had been some secret prohibition on leaving the room It was\nonly when he had reached the en trance hall that he made a sudden\nmovement drew his foot from the living room and r ushed forward in\na panic In the hall he stretched his right hand far out towards\n the stairway as if out there there were some supernatural force\nwaiting to save him \n\nGregor realised that it was out of the question to let the chief\nclerk go away in this mood if his position in the firm was not to be\nput into extreme danger Tha t was something his parents did not\nunderstand very well over the years they had be come convinced that\nthis job would provide for Gregor for his entire life and besid es\nthey had so much to worry about at present that they had lost sight\nof any thou ght for the future Gregor though did think about the\nfuture The chief clerk had t o be held back calmed down convinced\nand finally won over the future of Gregor and his family depended\non it If only his sister were here She was clever she was alrea dy\nin tears while Gregor was still lying peacefully on his back And\nthe chief cle rk was a lover of women surely she could persuade him\nshe would close the front doo r in the entrance hall and talk him out\nof his shocked state But his sister was no t there Gregor would\nhave to do the job himself And without considering that he st ill\nwas not familiar with how well he could move about in his present\nstate or tha t his speech still might not or probably would not \nbe understood he let go of the door pushed himself through the\nopening tried to reach the chief clerk on the landi ng who\nridiculously was holding on to the banister with both hands but\nGregor fell immediately over and with a little scream as he sought\nsomething to hold onto lande d on his numerous little legs Hardly\nhad that happened than for the first time tha t day he began to\nfeel alright with his body the little legs had the solid ground\n under them to his pleasure they did exactly as he told them they\nwere even making t he effort to carry him where he wanted to go and\nhe was soon believing that all his sorrows would soon be finally at\nan end He held back the urge to move but swayed f rom side to side\nas he crouched there on the floor His mother was not far away in \nfront of him and seemed at first quite engrossed in herself but\nthen she suddenly jumped up with her arms outstretched and her\nfingers spread shouting Help for pitys sake Help The way she\nheld her head suggested she wanted to see Gregor better but the\nunthinking way she was hurrying backwards showed that she did not\nshe had forg otten that the table was behind her with all the\nbreakfast things on it when she re ached the table she sat quickly\ndown on it without knowing what she was doing witho ut even seeming\nto notice that the coffee pot had been knocked over and a gush of\n coffee was pouring down onto the carpet\n\nMother mother said Gregor gently looking up at her He had\ncompletely forgotten the chief clerk for the moment but could not \nhelp himself snapping in the air with his jaws at the sight of the\nflow of coffee That set his mother screaming anew she fled from\nthe table and into the arms of his father as he rushed towards her\nGregor though had no time to spare for his parents now the chief\nclerk had already reached the stairs with his chin on the banister\nh e looked back for the last time Gregor made a run for him he\nwanted to be sure of reaching him the chief clerk must have\nexpected something as he leapt down several steps at once and\ndisappeared his shouts resounding all around the staircase The\n flight of the chief clerk seemed unfortunately to put Gregors\nfather into a panic a s well Until then he had been relatively self\ncontrolled but now instead of runnin g after the chief clerk\nhimself or at least not impeding Gregor as he ran after him \nGregors father seized the chief clerks stick in his right hand\nthe chief clerk ha d left it behind on a chair along with his hat\nand overcoat picked up a large newsp aper from the table with his\nleft and used them to drive Gregor back into his room stamping his\nfoot at him as he went Gregors appeals to his father were of no\nhelp his appeals were simply not understood however much he humbly\nturned his head his f ather merely stamped his foot all the harder\nAcross the room despite the chilly wea ther Gregors mother had\npulled open a window leant far out of it and pressed her ha nds to\nher face A strong draught of air flew in from the street towards\nthe stair way the curtains flew up the newspapers on the table\nfluttered and some of them wer

e blown onto the floor Nothing would\nstop Gregors father as he drove him back maki ng hissing noises at\nhim like a wild man Gregor had never had any practice in movi ng\nbackwards and was only able to go very slowly If Gregor had only\nbeen allowed to turn round he would have been back in his room\nstraight away but he was afraid t hat if he took the time to do that\nhis father would become impatient and there was the threat of a\nlethal blow to his back or head from the stick in his fathers hand \nany moment Eventually though Gregor realised that he had no\nchoice as he saw to his disgust that he was quite incapable of\ngoing backwards in a straight line so he began as quickly as\npossible and with frequent anxious glances at his father to tur n\nhimself round It went very slowly but perhaps his father was able\nto see his go od intentions as he did nothing to hinder him in fact\nnow and then he used the tip of his stick to give directions from a\ndistance as to which way to turn If only hi s father would stop\nthat unbearable hissing It was making Gregor quite confused Wh en\nhe had nearly finished turning round still listening to that\nhissing he made a mistake and turned himself back a little the way\nhe had just come He was pleased w hen he finally had his head in\nfront of the doorway but then saw that it was too na rrow and his\nbody was too broad to get evening that Gregor awoke\nfrom his deep and comalike sleep He would have woken soo n\nafterwards anyway even if he hadnt been disturbed as he had had\nenough sleep and felt fully rested But he had the impression that\nsome hurried steps and the sound of the door leading into the front\nroom being carefully shut had woken him The lig ht from the \nelectric street lamps shone palely here and there onto the ceiling \nand tops of the furniture but down below where Gregor was it was\ndark He pushed himsel f over to the door feeling his way clumsily\nwith his antennae of which he was now beginning to learn the value\n in order to see what had been happening there The wh ole of his\nleft side seemed like one painfully stretched scar and he limped\nbadly on his two rows of legs One of the legs had been badly\ninjured in the events of th at morning it was nearly a miracle that\nonly one of them had been and dragged alo ng lifelessly\n\nIt was only when he had reached the door that he realised what it\n actually was that had drawn him over to it it was the smell of\nsomething to eat By the door there was a dish filled with\nsweetened milk with little pieces of white br ead floating in it He\nwas so pleased he almost laughed as he was even hungrier tha n he\nhad been that morning and immediately dipped his head into the\nmilk nearly co vering his eyes with it But he soon normally\nbe sat with his evening paper reading it out in a loud voice to\nGregors mother and sometimes to his sister but th ere was now not\na sound to be heard Gregors sister would often write and tell him \nabout this reading but maybe his father had lost the habit in\nrecent times It wa s so quiet all around too even though there\nmust have been somebody in the flat Wh at a quiet life it is the\nfamily lead said Gregor to himself and gazing into the da rkness\nfelt a great pride that he was able to provide a life like that in\nsuch a n ice home for his sister and parents But what now if all\nthis peace and wealth and

comfort should come to a horrible and\nfrightening end That was something that Grego r did not want to\nthink about too much so he started to move about crawling up and \ndown the room\n\nOnce during that long evening the door on one side of the room wa s\nopened very slightly and hurriedly closed again later on the door\non the other s ide did the same it seemed that someone needed to\nenter the room but thought better of it Gregor went and waited\nimmediately by the door resolved either to bring the timorous\nvisitor into the room in some way or at least to find out who it\nwas but the door was opened no more that night and Gregor waited in\nvain The previous morn ing while the doors were locked everyone had\nwanted to get in there to him but now now that he had opened up\none of the doors and the other had clearly been unlocked some time\nduring the day noone came and the keys were in the other sides\n\nIt was not until late at night that the gaslight in the living room\nwas put out and now it was easy to see that his parents and sister had\nstayed awake all that time as they all could be distinctly heard as \nthey went away together on tiptoe It was clear th at noone would\ncome into Gregors room any more until morning that gave him plenty\n of time to think undisturbed about how he would have to rearrange\nhis life For som e reason the tall empty room where he was forced\nto remain made him feel uneasy as he lay there flat on the floor\neven though he had been living in it for five years Hardly aware\nof what he was doing other than a slight feeling of shame he\nhurried under the couch It pressed down on his back a little and\nhe was no longer able to lift his head but he nonetheless felt\nimmediately at ease and his only regret was t hat his body was too\nbroad to get it all underneath\n\nHe spent the whole night the re Some of the time he passed in a\nlight sleep although he frequently woke from it in alarm because of\nhis hunger and some of the time was spent in worries and vague \nhopes which however always led to the same conclusion for the\ntime being he must remain calm he must show patience and the \ngreatest consideration so that his family could bear the\nunpleasantness that he in his present condition was forced to\nimpos e on them\n\nGregor soon had the opportunity to test the strength of his\ndecisions as early the next morning almost before the night had\nended his sister nearly fully dressed opened the door from the\nfront room and looked anxiously in She did not se e him straight\naway but when she did notice him under the couch he had to be\nsome where for Gods sake he couldnt have flown away she was so\nshocked that she lost co ntrol of herself and slammed the door shut\nagain from outside But she seemed to re gret her behaviour as she\nopened the door again straight away and came in on tiptoe as if\nentering the room of someone seriously ill or even of a stranger\nGregor had pushed his head forward right to the edge of the couch\nand watched her Would she n otice that he had left the milk as it\nwas realise that it was not from any lack of hunger and bring him\nin some other food that was more suitable If she didnt do it\n herself he would rather go hungry than draw her attention to it\nalthough he did fee l a terrible urge to rush forward from under the\ncouch throw himself at his sisters feet and beg her for something\ngood to eat However his sister noticed the full dis h immediately\nand looked at it and the few drops of milk splashed around it with\ns ome surprise She immediately picked it up using a rag\nnot her bare hands and car ried it out Gregor was extremely\ncurious as to what she would bring in its place i magining the\nwildest possibilities but he never could have guessed what his\nsister in her goodness actually did bring In order to test his\ntaste she brought him a wh ole selection of things all spread out\non an old newspaper There were old halfrott en vegetables bones\nfrom the evening meal covered in white sauce that had gone hard a\nfew raisins and almonds some cheese that Gregor had declared\ninedible two days b efore a dry roll and some bread spread with\nbutter and salt As well as all that sh e had poured some water into\nthe dish which had probably been permanently set aside for Gregors\nuse and placed it beside them Then out of consideration for\nGregors f eelings as she knew that he would not eat in front of\nher she hurried out again and even turned the key in the lock so\nthat Gregor would know he could make things as c omfortable for\nhimself as he liked Gregors little legs whirred at last he could\ne at Whats more his injuries must already have completely healed\nas he found no diff iculty in moving This amazed him as more than\na month earlier he had cut his finge r slightly with a knife he\nthought of how his finger had still hurt the day before yesterday\nAm I less sensitive than I used to be then he thought and was\nalready su cking greedily at the cheese which had immediately almost\ncompellingly attracted hi m much more than the other foods on the\nnewspaper Quickly one after another his ey es watering with\npleasure he consumed the cheese the vegetables and the sauce the\n fresh foods on the other hand he didnt like at all and even\ndragged the things he d id want to eat a little way away from them\nbecause he couldnt stand the smell Long

after he had finished\neating and lay lethargic in the same place his sister slowly turned\nthe key in the lock as a sign to him that he should withdraw He\nwas immedi ately startled although he had been half asleep and he\nhurried back under the couch But he needed great selfcontrol to\nstay there even for the short time that his sist er was in the room\nas eating so much food had rounded out his body a little and he \ncould hardly breathe in that narrow space Half suffocating he\nwatched with bulgi ng eyes as his sister unselfconsciously took a\nbroom and swept up the leftovers mix ing them in with the food he\nhad not even touched at all as if it could not be used any more\nShe quickly dropped it all into a bin closed it with its wooden\nlid and c arried everything out She had hardly turned her back\nbefore Gregor came out again from under the couch and stretched\nhimself\n\nThis was how Gregor received his food each day now once in the\nmorning while his parents and the maid were still asleep a nd the\nsecond time after everyone had eaten their meal at midday as his\nparents wo uld sleep for a little while then as well and Gregors\nsister would send the maid aw ay on some errand Gregors father and\nmother certainly did not want him to starve e ither but perhaps it\nwould have been more than they could stand to have any more\ne xperience of his feeding than being told about it and perhaps his\nsister wanted to spare them what distress she could as they were\nindeed suffering enough\n\nIt was i mpossible for Gregor to find out what they had told the\ndoctor and the locksmith th at first morning to get them out of the \nflat As nobody could understand him nobody not even his sister\nthought that he could understand them so he had to be content t o\nhear his sisters sighs and appeals to the saints as she moved about\nhis room It was only later when she had become a little more used\nto everything there was of c ourse no question of her ever\nbecoming fully used to the situation that Gregor wou ld sometimes\ncatch a friendly comment or at least a comment that could be\nconstrue d as friendly Hes enjoyed his dinner today she might\nsay when he had diligently cl eared away all the food left for him\nor if he left most of it which slowly became m ore and more\nfrequent she would often say sadly now everythings just been\nleft the re again\n\nAlthough Gregor wasnt able to hear any news directly he did listen\nto m uch of what was said in the next rooms and whenever he heard\nanyone speaking he wou ld scurry straight to the appropriate door and\npress his whole body against it The re was seldom any conversation\nespecially at first that was not about him in some w ay even if\nonly in secret For two whole days all the talk at every mealtime\nwas a bout what they should do now but even between meals they spoke\nabout the same subje ct as there were always at least two members of\nthe family at home nobody wanted t o be at home by themselves and\nit was out of the question to leave the flat entirel y empty And on\nthe very first day the maid had fallen to her knees and begged\nGre gors mother to let her go without delay It was not very clear\nhow much she knew of what had happened but she left within a quarter\nof an hour tearfully thanking Grego rs mother for her dismissal as\nif she had done her an enormous service. She even sw ore\nemphatically not to tell anyone the slightest about what had\nhappened even tho ugh noone had asked that of her\n\nNow Gregors sister also had to help his mother wi th the cooking\nalthough that was not so much bother as noone ate very much\nGregor often heard how one of them would unsuccessfully urge another\nto eat and receive no more answer than no thanks Ive had enough\nor something similar Noone drank very mu ch either His sister\nwould sometimes ask his father whether he would like a beer h oping\nfor the chance to go and fetch it herself When his father then\nsaid nothing she would add so that he would not feel selfish that\nshe could send the housekeeper for it but then his father would\nclose the matter with a big loud No and no more wo uld be said\n\nEven before the first day had come to an end his father had\nexplaine d to Gregors mother and sister what their finances and\nprospects were Now and then he stood up from the table and took\nsome receipt or document from the little cash b ox he had saved from\nhis business when it had collapsed five years earlier Gregor heard\nhow he opened the complicated lock and then closed it again after he\nhad tak en the item he wanted What he heard his father say was some\nof the first good news that Gregor heard since he had first been\nincarcerated in his room He had thought that nothing at all\nremained from his fathers business at least he had never told h im\nanything different and Gregor had never asked him about it anyway\nTheir busines s misfortune had reduced the family to a state of total\ndespair and Gregors only co ncern at that time had been to arrange\nthings so that they could all forget about i t as quickly as\npossible So then he started working especially hard with a fiery\n vigour that raised him from a junior salesman to a travelling\nrepresentative almost overnight bringing with it the chance to earn\nmoney in quite different ways Gregor converted his success at work\nstraight into cash that he could lay on the table at

home for the\nbenefit of his astonished and delighted family They had been good\nti mes and they had never come again at least not with the same\nsplendour even though Gregor had later earned so much that he was\nin a position to bear the costs of the whole family and did bear\nthem They had even got used to it both Gregor and the fa mily\nthey took the money with gratitude and he was glad to provide it\nalthough the re was no longer much warm affection given in return\nGregor only remained close to his sister now Unlike him she was\nvery fond of music and a gifted and expressive v iolinist it was his\nsecret plan to send her to the conservatory next year even thou gh it\nwould cause great expense that would have to be made up for in some\nother wa y During Gregors short periods in town conversation with\nhis sister would often tu rn to the conservatory but it was only ever\nmentioned as a lovely dream that could never be realised Their\nparents did not like to hear this innocent talk but Gregor thought\nabout it quite hard and decided he would let them know what he\nplanned wit h a grand announcement of it on Christmas day\n\nThat was the sort of totally pointl ess thing that went through his\nmind in his present state pressed upright against t he door and\nlistening There were times when he simply became too tired to\ncontinu e listening when his head would fall wearily against the\ndoor and he would pull it up again with a start as even the\nslightest noise he caused would be heard next doo r and they would\nall go silent Whats that hes doing now his father would say\nafte r a while clearly having gone over to the door and only then\nwould the interrupted conversation slowly be taken up again\n\nWhen explaining things his father repeated himself several times\npartly because it was a long time since he had been occupied with\nthese matters himself and partly because Gregors mother did not\nunderstand ev erything the first time From these repeated explanations\nGregor learned to his ple asure that despite all their misfortunes\nthere was still some money available from the old days It was not\na lot but it had not been touched in the meantime and some interest\nhad accumulated Besides that they had not been using up all the\nmoney th at Gregor had been bringing home every month keeping only a\nlittle for himself so t hat that too had been accumulating\nBehind the door Gregor nodded with enthusiasm in his pleasure at\nthis unexpected thrift and caution He could actually have used\nth is surplus money to reduce his fathers debt to his boss and the \nday when he could h ave freed himself from that job would have come\nmuch closer but now it was certainl y better the way his father had\ndone things\n\nThis money however was certainly not enough to enable the family\nto live off the interest it was enough to maintain them for\nperhaps one or two years no more Thats to say it was money\nthat should not re ally be touched but set aside for emergencies\nmoney to live on had to be earned Hi s father was healthy but old\nand lacking in self confidence During the five years that he had\nnot been working the first holiday in a life that had been full of\nst rain and no success he had put on a lot of weight and become\nvery slow and clumsy Would Gregors elderly mother now have to go\nand earn money She suffered from asthma and it was a strain for her\njust to move about the home every other day would be sp ent\nstruggling for breath on the sofa by the open window Would his\nsister have to go and earn money She was still a child of\nseventeen her life up till then had been very enviable consisting\nof wearing nice clothes sleeping late helping out in the b usiness\njoining in with a few modest pleasures and most of all playing the\nviolin Whenever they began to talk of the need to earn money\nGregor would always first let go of the door and then throw himself\nonto the cool leather sofa next to it as he b ecame quite hot with\nshame and regret\n\nHe would often lie there the whole night t hrough not sleeping a\nwink but scratching at the leather for hours on end Or he mi ght go\nto all the effort of pushing a chair to the window climbing up onto\nthe sil l and propped up in the chair leaning on the window to\nstare out of it He had used to feel a great sense of freedom from\ndoing this but doing it now was obviously som ething more remembered\nthan experienced as what he actually saw in this way was be coming\nless distinct every day even things that were quite near he had\nused to cur se the everpresent view of the hospital across the\nstreet but now he could not see it at all and if he had not known\nthat he lived in Charlottenstrasse which was a qu iet street despite\nbeing in the middle of the city he could have thought that he wa s\nlooking out the window at a barren waste where the grey sky and the\ngrey earth m ingled inseparably His observant sister only needed to\nnotice the chair twice befo re she would always push it back to its\nexact position by the window after she had tidied up the room and\neven left the inner pane of the window open from then on\n\n If Gregor had only been able to speak to his sister and thank her\nfor all that she had to do for him it would have been easier for him\nto bear it but as it was it cau sed him pain His sister\nnaturally tried as far as possible to pretend there was no

thing\nburdensome about it and the longer it went on of course the\nbetter she was a ble to do so but as time went by Gregor was also\nable to see through it all so much better It had even become very\nunpleasant for him now whenever she entered the roo m No sooner\nhad she come in than she would quickly close the door as a\nprecaution so that noone would have to suffer the view into\nGregors room then she would go str aight to the window and pull it\nhurriedly open almost as if she were suffocating E ven if it was\ncold she would stay at the window breathing deeply for a little\nwhil e She would alarm Gregor twice a day with this running about\nand noise making he w ould stay under the couch shivering the whole\nwhile knowing full well that she woul d certainly have liked to\nspare him this ordeal but it was impossible for her to be in the\nsame room with him with the windows closed\n\nOne day about a month after Gr egors transformation when his sister\nno longer had any particular reason to be shoc ked at his appearance\nshe came into the room a little earlier than usual and found him\nstill staring out the window motionless and just where he would be\nmost horrib le In itself his sisters not coming into the room\nwould have been no surprise for Gregor as it would have been\ndifficult for her to immediately open the window while he was still\nthere but not only did she not come in she went straight back and\nclo sed the door behind her a stranger would have thought he had\nthreatened her and tri ed to bite her Gregor went straight to hide\nhimself under the couch of course but he had to wait until midday\nbefore his sister came back and she seemed much more un easy than\nusual It made him realise that she still found his appearance\nunbearabl e and would continue to do so she probably even had to\novercome the urge to flee wh en she saw the little bit of him that\nprotruded from under the couch One day in or der to spare her even\nthis sight he spent four hours carrying the bedsheet over to the\ncouch on his back and arranged it so that he was completely covered\nand his si ster would not be able to see him even if she bent down\nIf she did not think this s heet was necessary then all she had to do\nwas take it off again as it was clear eno ugh that it was no\npleasure for Gregor to cut himself off so completely She left t he\nsheet where it was Gregor even thought he glimpsed a look of\ngratitude one tim e when he carefully looked out from under the sheet\nto see how his sister liked the new arrangement\n\nFor the first fourteen days Gregors parents could not bring\nthem selves to come into the room to see him He would often hear\nthem say how they appr eciated all the new work his sister was doing\neven though before they had seen her as a girl who was somewhat\nuseless and frequently been annoyed with her But now th e two of\nthem father and mother would often both wait outside the door of\nGregors room while his sister tidied up in there and as soon as\nshe went out again she woul d have to tell them exactly how\neverything looked what Gregor had eaten how he had behaved this \ntime and whether perhaps any slight improvement could be seen \nHis mot her also wanted to go in and visit Gregor relatively soon but\nhis father and sister at first persuaded her against it Gregor\nlistened very closely to all this and app roved fully Later\nthough she had to be held back by force which made her call out \nLet me go and see Gregor he is my unfortunate son Cant you\nunderstand I have to s ee him and Gregor would think to himself\nthat maybe it would be better if his mothe r came in not every day\nof course but one day a week perhaps she could understand\n everything much better than his sister who for all her courage was\nstill just a chi ld after all and really might not have had an\nadults appreciation of the burdensome job she had taken on\n\nGregors wish to see his mother was soon realised Out of\nco nsideration for his parents Gregor wanted to avoid being seen at\nthe window during the day the few square meters of the floor did\nnot give him much room to crawl abou t it was hard to just lie\nquietly through the night his food soon stopped giving hi m any\npleasure at all and so to entertain himself he got into the habit\nof crawlin g up and down the walls and ceiling He was especially\nfond of hanging from the cei ling it was quite different from lying\non the floor he could breathe more freely hi s body had a light\nswing to it and up there relaxed and almost happy it might happe n\nthat he would surprise even himself by letting go of the ceiling and\nlanding on the floor with a crash But now of course he had far\nbetter control of his body tha n before and even with a fall as\ngreat as that caused himself no damage Very soon his sister\nnoticed Gregors new way of entertaining himself he had after\nall left traces of the adhesive from his feet as he crawled about \nand got it into her head to make it as easy as possible for him by\nremoving the furniture that got in his wa y especially the chest of\ndrawers and the desk Now this was not something that she would be\nable to do by herself she did not dare to ask for help from her\nfather th e sixteen year old maid had carried on bravely since the\ncook had left but she cert ainly would not have helped in this she\nhad even asked to be allowed to keep the ki

sounding as if he were both\n angry and glad at the same time Gregor drew his head back from the \ndoor and lifted it towards his father He really had not imagined\nhis father the way he stood there now of late with his new habit\nof crawling about he had neglected to pay attention to what was\ngoing on the rest of the flat the way he had done before He really\nou ght to have expected things to have changed but still still was\nthat really his fat her The same tired man as used to be laying\nthere entombed in his bed when Gregor c ame back from his business\ntrips who would receive him sitting in the armchair in h is\nnightgown when he came back in the evenings who was hardly even\nable to stand u p but as a sign of his pleasure would just raise\nhis arms and who on the couple of times a year when they went for a\nwalk together on a Sunday or public holiday wrapp ed up tightly in\nhis overcoat between Gregor and his mother would always labour his \nway forward a little more slowly than them who were already walking\nslowly for hi s sake who would place his stick down carefully and\nif he wanted to say something w ould invariably stop and gather his\ncompanions around him He was standing up strai ght enough now\ndressed in a smart blue uniform with gold buttons the sort worn by\n the employees at the banking institute above the high stiff collar\nof the coat his strong doublechin emerged under the bushy\neyebrows his piercing dark eyes looked ou t fresh and alert his\nnormally unkempt white hair was combed down painfully close t o his\nscalp He took his cap with its gold monogram from probably some\nbank and th rew it in an arc right across the room onto the sofa\nput his hands in his trouser p ockets pushing back the bottom of his\nlong uniform coat and with look of determinat ion walked towards\nGregor He probably did not even know himself what he had in min d\nbut nonetheless lifted his feet unusually high Gregor was amazed\nat the enormou s size of the soles of his boots but wasted no time\nwith that he knew full well ri ght from the first day of his new\nlife that his father thought it necessary to alwa ys be extremely\nstrict with him And so he ran up to his father stopped when his\nf ather stopped scurried forwards again when he moved even\nslightly In this way they went round the room several times\nwithout anything decisive happening she pushed herself to his father her arms\naround him uniting herself with him totally now Gregor lost hi s\nability to see anything her hands behind his fathers head begging\nhim to spare Gregors life\n\n\nIII\n\nNoone dared to remove the apple lodged in Gregors flesh so it\nremained there as a visible reminder of his injury He had suffered\nit there for more than a month and his condition seemed serious\nenough to remind even his fa

All of them were usually very quiet nowadays Soon after dinner\nhis father would go to sleep in his chair his mother and sister\nwould urge each other t o be quiet his mother bent deeply under the\nlamp would sew fancy underwear for a fa shion shop his sister who\nhad taken a sales job learned shorthand and French in the evenings\nso that she might be able to get a better position later on\nSometimes his father would wake up and say to Gregors mother\nyoure doing so much sewing again tod ay as if he did not know\nthat he had been dozing and then he would go back to slee p again\nwhile mother and sister would exchange a tired grin\n\nWith a kind of stubb ornness Gregors father refused to take his\nuniform off even at home while his night gown hung unused on its peg\nGregors father would slumber where he was fully dressed as if\nalways ready to serve and expecting to hear the voice of his\nsuperior even h ere The uniform had not been new to start with but\nas a result of this it slowly b ecame even shabbier despite the\nefforts of Gregors mother and sister to look after it Gregor\nwould often spend the whole evening looking at all the stains on\nthis c oat with its gold buttons always kept polished and shiny\nwhile the old man in it wo uld sleep highly uncomfortable but\npeaceful\n\nAs soon as it struck ten Gregors mot her would speak gently to his\nfather to wake him and try to persuade him to go to b ed as he\ncouldnt sleep properly where he was and he really had to get his\nsleep if he was to be up at six to get to work But since he had\nbeen in work he had become more obstinate and would always insist on\nstaying longer at the table even though h e regularly fell asleep\nand it was then harder than ever to persuade him to exchang e the\nchair for his bed Then however much mother and sister would\nimportune him w ith little reproaches and warnings he would keep\nslowly shaking his head for a quar ter of an hour with his eyes\nclosed and refusing to get up Gregors mother would tu g at his\nsleeve whisper endearments into his ear Gregors sister would\nleave her wo rk to help her mother but nothing would have any effect\non him He would just sink deeper into his chair Only when the \ntwo women took him under the arms he would abr uptly open his eyes\nlook at them one after the other and say What a life This is wh at\npeace I get in my old age And supported by the two women he would\nlift himself up carefully as if he were carrying the greatest load\nhimself let the women take hi m to the door send them off and carry\non by himself while Gregors mother would thro w down her needle and\nhis sister her pen so that they could run after his father an d\ncontinue being of help to him\n\nWho in this tired and overworked family would ha ve had time to\ngive more attention to Gregor than was absolutely necessary The\nhou sehold budget became even smaller so now the maid was dismissed\nan enormous thickbo ned charwoman with white hair that flapped\naround her head came every morning and e vening to do the heaviest\nwork everything else was looked after by Gregors mother o n top of\nthe large amount of sewing work she did Gregor even learned\nlistening to the evening conversation about what price they had\nhoped for that several items of jewellery belonging to the family\nhad been sold even though both mother and sister had been very fond\nof wearing them at functions and celebrations But the loudest\n complaint was that although the flat was much too big for their\npresent circumstanc es they could not move out of it there was no\nimaginable way of transferring Gregor to the new address He could\nsee quite well though that there were more reasons tha n\nconsideration for him that made it difficult for them to move it\nwould have been quite easy to transport him in any suitable crate\nwith a few air holes in it the ma in thing holding the family back\nfrom their decision to move was much more to do wi th their total\ndespair and the thought that they had been struck with a misfortune \nunlike anything experienced by anyone else they knew or were related\nto They car ried out absolutely everything that the world expects\nfrom poor people Gregors fath

er brought bank employees their\nbreakfast his mother sacrificed herself by washing clothes for\nstrangers his sister ran back and forth behind her desk at the\nbehest of the customers but they just did not have the strength to\ndo any more And the in jury in Gregors back began to hurt as much\nas when it was new After they had come back from taking his father\nto bed Gregors mother and sister would now leave their work where\nit was and sit close together cheek to cheek his mother would\npoint to Gregors room and say Close that door Grete and then\nwhen he was in the dark again t hey would sit in the next room and ntheir tears would mingle or they would simply si t there staring\ndryeyed at the table\n\nGregor hardly slept at all either night or day Sometimes he would\nthink of taking over the familys affairs just like before t he\nnext time the door was opened he had long forgotten about his boss\nand the chie f clerk but they would appear again in his thoughts\nthe salesmen and the apprentice s that stupid teaboy two or three\nfriends from other businesses one of the chamberm aids from a\nprovincial hotel a tender memory that appeared and disappeared\nagain a cashier from a hat shop for whom his attention had been\nserious but too slow all o f them appeared to him mixed together\nwith strangers and others he had forgotten bu t instead of helping\nhim and his family they were all of them inaccessible and he w as\nglad when they disappeared Other times he was not at all in the\nmood to look a fter his family he was filled with simple rage about\nthe lack of attention he was s hown and although he could think of\nnothing he would have wanted he made plans of h ow he could get into\nthe pantry where he could take all the things he was entitled to\neven if he was not hungry Gregors sister no longer thought about\nhow she could please him but would hurriedly push some food or other\ninto his room with her foot before she rushed out to work in the\nmorning and at midday and in the evening she w ould sweep it away\nagain with the broom indifferent as to whether it had been eaten or\n more often than not had been left totally untouched She still\ncleared up the room in the evening but now she could not have been\nany quicker about it Smears of dirt were left on the walls here\nand there were little balls of dust and filth At first Gregor\nwent into one of the worst of these places when his sister arrived\nas a reproach to her but he could have stayed there for weeks\nwithout his sister doing anything about it she could see the dirt\nas well as he could but she had simply dec ided to leave him to it\nAt the same time she became touchy in a way that was quite new for\nher and which everyone in the family understood cleaning up\nGregors room was for her and her alone Gregors mother did once\nthoroughly clean his room and ne eded to use several bucketfuls of\nwater to do it although that much dampness also made Gregor ill\nand he lay flat on the couch bitter and immobile But his mother\nw as to be punished still more for what she had done as hardly had\nhis sister arrived home in the evening than she noticed the change\nin Gregors room and highly aggrieve d ran back into the living\nroom where despite her mothers raised and imploring hand s she\nbroke into convulsive tears Her father of course was startled\nout of his ch air and the two parents looked on astonished and\nhelpless then they too became agit ated Gregors father standing\nto the right of his mother accused her of not leaving the cleaning\nof Gregors room to his sister from her left Gregors sister\nscreamed a t her that she was never to clean Gregors room again\nwhile his mother tried to draw his father who was beside himself\nwith anger into the bedroom his sister quaking wi th tears\nthumped on the table with her small fists and Gregor hissed in\nanger that noone had even thought of closing the door to save him\nthe sight of this and all it s noise\n\nGregors sister was exhausted from going out to work and looking\nafter Gr egor as she had done before was even more work for her but\neven so his mother ought certainly not to have taken her place\nGregor on the other hand ought not to be negl ected Now though\nthe charwoman was here This elderly widow with a robust bone\nst ructure that made her able to withstand the hardest of things in\nher long life wasn t really repelled by Gregor Just by chance one\nday rather than any real curiosity she opened the door to Gregors\nroom and found herself face to face with him He was taken totally\nby surprise noone was chasing him but he began to rush to and fro\nwh ile she just stood there in amazement with her hands crossed in\nfront of her From then on she never failed to open the door\nslightly every evening and morning and lo ok briefly in on him At\nfirst she would call to him as she did so with words that she\nprobably considered friendly such as come on then you old\ndungbeetle or look a t the old dungbeetle there Gregor never\nresponded to being spoken to in that way b ut just remained where he\nwas without moving as if the door had never even been ope ned If\nonly they had told this charwoman to clean up his room every day\ninstead o f letting her disturb him for no reason whenever she felt\nlike it One day early in the morning while a heavy rain struck the\nwindowpanes perhaps indicating that sprin

g was coming she began to\nspeak to him in that way once again Gregor was so resent ful of it\nthat he started to move toward her he was slow and infirm but it\nwas lik e a kind of attack Instead of putting things into this room\nthat they had no room for anywhere else and there were now many\nsuch things a s one of the rooms in the flat had been rented out to\nthree gentlemen These earnes t gentlemen all three of them had\nfull beards as Gregor learned peering through th e crack in the door\none day were painfully insistent on things being tidy This\nm eant not only in their own room but since they had taken a room in\nthis establishme nt in the entire flat and especially in the\nkitchen Unnecessary clutter was someth ing they could not tolerate\nespecially if it was dirty They had moreover brought m ost of their\nown furnishings and equipment with them For this reason many\nthings had become superfluous which although they could not be\nsold the family did not wis h to discard All these things found\ntheir way into Gregors room The dustbins from the kitchen found\ntheir way in there too The charwoman was always in a hurry and\n anything she couldnt use for the time being kitchen Nonetheless Gregors\nfather ca me into the living room before he went into the kitchen\nbowed once with his cap in his hand and did his round of the table\nThe gentlemen stood as one and mumbled some thing into their beards\n Then once they were alone they ate in near perfect silence It\nseemed remarkable to Gregor that above all the various noises of\neating their c hewing teeth could still be heard as if they had\nwanted to show Gregor that you nee d teeth in order to eat and it was\nnot possible to perform anything with jaws that are toothless\nhowever nice they might be Id like to eat something said\nGregor anx iously but not anything like theyre eating They do\nfeed themselves And here I am dying\n\nThroughout all this time Gregor could not remember having heard the\nviolin being played but this evening it began to be heard from the\nkitchen The three gent lemen had already finished their meal the\none in the middle had produced a newspape r given a page to been the violin play er\nhimself The gentlemen stepped back into the room and waited\nGregors father soo n appeared with the music stand his mother with\nthe music and his sister with the v iolin She calmly prepared\neverything for her to begin playing his parents who had never\nrented a room out before and therefore showed an exaggerated\ncourtesy toward s the three gentlemen did not even dare to sit on\ntheir own chairs his father leant against the door with his right\nhand pushed in between two buttons on his uniform c oat his mother\nthough was offered a seat by one of the gentlemen and sat leaving\n the chair where the gentleman happened to have placed it out of\nthe way in a corne r\n\nHis sister began to play father and mother paid close attention\none on each si de to the movements of her hands Drawn in by the\nplaying Gregor had dared to come forward a little and already had\nhis head in the living room Before he had taken g reat pride in\nhow considerate he was but now it sister would break\nout in tea rs of emotion and Gregor would climb up to her shoulder\nand kiss her neck which sin ce she had been going out to work she\nhad kept free without any necklace or collar \n\nMr Samsa shouted the middle gentleman to Gregors father\npointing without wastin g any more words with his forefinger at\nGregor as he slowly moved forward The viol in went silent the\nmiddle of the three gentlemen first smiled at his two friends\ns haking his head and then looked back at Gregor His father seemed\nto think it more important to calm the three gentlemen before\ndriving Gregor out even though they we re not at all upset and\nseemed to think Gregor was more entertaining than the violi n playing\nhad been He rushed up to them with his arms spread out and\nattempted to drive them back into their room at the same time as\ntrying to block their view of G regor with his body Now they did\nbecome a little annoyed and it was not clear whet her it was his\nfathers behaviour that annoyed them or the dawning realisation that \nthey had had a neighbour like Gregor in the next room without\nknowing it They as ked Gregors father for explanations raised\ntheir arms like he had tugged excitedly

andoned his mother as she pushed herself vigorously out of her\nchair as if more wil ling to sacrifice her own mother than stay\nanywhere near Gregor She rushed over to behind her father who had\nbecome excited merely because she was and stood up half r aising his\nhands in front of Gregors sister as if to protect her\n\nBut Gregor had had no intention of frightening anyone least of all\nhis sister All he had done was begin to turn round so that he\ncould go back into his room although that was in its elf quite\nstartling as his painwracked condition meant that turning to move straight ahead He was\namazed at the great distance that separated him from his room and\ncould not understand how he had covered that d istance in his weak\nstate a little while before and almost without noticing it He \nconcentrated on crawling as fast as he could and hardly noticed that\nthere was no t a word not any cry from his family to distract him\nHe did not turn his head until he had reached the doorway He did\nnot turn it all the way round as he felt his nec k becoming stiff\nbut it was nonetheless enough to see that nothing behind him had\n changed only his sister had stood up With his last glance he saw\nthat his mother h ad now fallen completely asleep\n\nHe was hardly inside his room before the door was hurriedly shut\nbolted and locked The sudden noise behind lying there stone dead\n\nMr and Mrs Samsa sat upright there in their marriage bed and had\nto make an effort to get over the shock caused by the cleaner before\nthey could grasp what she was saying But then each from his own\nside they hurried out o f bed Mr Samsa threw the blanket over his\nshoulders Mrs Samsa just came out in he r nightdress and that is\nhow they went into Gregors room On the way they opened th e door\nto the living room where Grete had been sleeping since the three\ngentlemen had moved in she was fully dressed as if she had never\nbeen asleep and the paleness of her face seemed to confirm this\nDead asked Mrs Samsa looking at the charwoman e nquiringly\neven though she could have checked for herself and could have known\nit even without checking Thats what I said replied the\ncleaner and to prove it she g

ave Gregors body another shove with\nthe broom sending it sideways across the floor Mrs Samsa made a\nmovement as if she wanted to hold back the broom but did not\ncomp lete it Now then said Mr Samsa lets give thanks to God\nfor that He crossed himsel f and the three women followed his\nexample Grete who had not taken her eyes from t he corpse said\nJust look how thin he was He didnt eat anything for so long\nThe fo od came out again just the same as when it went in Gregors\nbody was indeed complete ly dried up and flat they had not seen it\nuntil then but now he was not lifted up o n his little legs nor did\nhe do anything to make them look away\n\nGrete come with us in here for a little while said Mrs Samsa\nwith a pained smile and Grete followe d her parents into the bedroom\nbut not without looking back at the body The cleane r shut the door\nand opened the window wide Although it was still early in the\nmor ning the fresh air had something of warmth mixed in with it It\nwas already the end of March after all\n\nThe three gentlemen stepped out of their room and looked round in\namazement for their breakfasts they had been forgotten about\nWhere is our brea kfast the middle gentleman asked the cleaner\nirritably She just put her finger on her lips and made a quick and\nsilent sign to the men that they might like to come i nto Gregors\nroom They did so and stood around Gregors corpse with their\nhands in the pockets of their wellworn coats It was now quite\nlight in the room\n\nThen the door of the bedroom opened and Mr Samsa appeared in his\nuniform with his Come and give me a\nbit of attention The two women immediately did as he s aid\nhurrying over to him where they kissed him and hugged him and then\nthey quickl y finished their letters\n\nAfter that the three of them left the flat together whic h was\nsomething they had not done for months and took the tram out to the\nopen cou ntry outside the town They had the tram filled with warm\nsunshine all to themselve s Leant back comfortably on their seats\nthey discussed their prospects and found t hat on closer examination\nthey were not at all bad until then they had never asked each\nother about their work but all three had jobs which were very good\nand held p articularly good promise for the future The greatest\nimprovement for the time bein g of course would be achieved quite\neasily 

up early all the\ntime", he thought, "it makes you stupid.', "You've got to get enou gh\nsleep.", 'Other travelling salesmen live a life of luxury.', 'For\ninstance, whe never I go back to the guest house during the morning\nto copy out the contract, the se gentlemen are always still sitting\nthere eating their breakfasts.', "I ought to just try that with my\nboss; I'd get kicked out on the spot.", 'But who knows, maybe that\nwould be the best thing for me.', "If I didn't have my parents to\nthink about I'd have given in my notice a long time ago, I'd have\ngone up to the boss and told him just what I think, tell him\neverything I would, let him know just what I fee 1.", "He'd fall right\noff his desk!", "And it's a funny sort of business to be sitt ing up\nthere at your desk, talking down at your subordinates from up there,\nespeci ally when you have to go right up close because the boss is\nhard of hearing.", "Wel 1, there's still some hope; once I've got the\nmoney together to pay off my parents' debt to him - another five or\nsix years I suppose - that's definitely what I'll d o.", "That's when\nI'll make the big change.", 'First of all though, I\'ve got to ge t up,\nmy train leaves at five."', 'And he looked over at the alarm clock, ticking o n the chest of\ndrawers.', '"God in Heaven!"', 'he thought.', 'It was half past six and the \nhands were quietly moving forwards, it was even later than half \npast, more like quarter to seven.', 'Had the alarm clock not rung?', "He\ncould see from the be d that it had been set for four o'clock as it\nshould have been; it certainly must h ave rung.", 'Yes, but was it\npossible to quietly sleep through that furniture-rattl ing noise?', 'True, he had not slept peacefully, but probably all the more deeply\nb ecause of that.', 'What should he do now?', 'The next train went at\nseven; if he we re to catch that he would have to rush like mad and\nthe collection of samples was s till not packed, and he did not at\nall feel particularly fresh and lively.', "And e ven if he did catch\nthe train he would not avoid his boss's anger as the office\nas sistant would have been there to see the five o'clock train go, he\nwould have put i n his report about Gregor's not being there a long\ntime ago.", "The office assistan t was the boss's man, spineless, and\nwith no understanding.", 'What about if he rep orted sick?', "But that\nwould be extremely strained and suspicious as in fifteen ye ars of\nservice Gregor had never once yet been ill. His boss would\ncertainly come round with the doctor from the medical insurance\ncompany, accuse his parents of hav ing a lazy son, and accept the \ndoctor's recommendation not to make any claim as the doctor believed\nthat no-one was ever ill but that many were workshy.", "And what's \nmore, would he have been entirely wrong in this case?", 'Gregor did in\nfact, apar t from excessive sleepiness after sleeping for so long,\nfeel completely well and ev en felt much hungrier than usual.', 'He was still hurriedly thinking all this throug h, unable to decide\nto get out of the bed, when the clock struck quarter to seve n.', 'There was a cautious knock at the door near his head.', '"Gregor", \nsomebody c alled - it was his mother - "it\'s quarter to seven.', 'Didn\'t you want to go somew here?"', 'That gentle voice!', 'Gregor was\nshocked when he heard his own voice answ ering, it could hardly be\nrecognised as the voice he had had before.', 'As if from deep inside\nhim, there was a painful and uncontrollable squeaking mixed in with\ni t, the words could be made out at first but then there was a sort\nof echo which mad e them unclear, leaving the hearer unsure whether\nhe had heard properly or not.', 'Gregor had wanted to give a full\nanswer and explain everything, but in the circums tances contented\nhimself with saying: "Yes, mother, yes, thank-you, I\'m getting up \nnow."', "The change in Gregor's voice probably could not be noticed\noutside throu gh the wooden door, as his mother was satisfied with\nthis explanation and shuffled away.", 'But this short conversation\nmade the other members of the family aware tha t Gregor, against\ntheir expectations was still at home, and soon his father came\nk nocking at one of the side doors, gently, but with his fist.', '"Gregor, Gregor", he called, "what\'s wrong?"', 'And after a short\nwhile he called again with a warning deepness in his voice: "Gregor!", 'Gregor!"', 'At the other side door his sister cam e plaintively:\n"Gregor?', "Aren't you well?", 'Do you need anything?"', 'Gregor ans wered to\nboth sides: "I\'m ready, now", making an effort to remove all the\nstrange ness from his voice by enunciating very carefully and putting\nlong pauses between e ach, individual word.', 'His father went back to\nhis breakfast, but his sister whis pered: "Gregor, open the door, I\nbeg of you."', 'Gregor, however, had no thought of opening the door,\nand instead congratulated himself for his cautious habit, acquire d\nfrom his travelling, of locking all doors at night even when he was\nat home.', 'The first thing he wanted to do was to get up in peace without being\ndisturbed, to get dressed, and most of all to have his breakfast.', 'Only then would he consider w hat to do next, as he was well aware\nthat he would not bring his thoughts to any se nsible conclusions by\nlying in bed.', 'He remembered that he had often felt a sligh

t pain in\nbed, perhaps caused by lying awkwardly, but that had always turned\nout t o be pure imagination and he wondered how his imaginings would\nslowly resolve thems elves today.', 'He did not have the slightest\ndoubt that the change in his voice wa s nothing more than the first\nsign of a serious cold, which was an occupational haz ard for\ntravelling salesmen.', 'It was a simple matter to throw off the covers; he only had to blow\nhimself up a little and they fell off by themselves.', 'But it bec ame\ndifficult after that, especially as he was so exceptionally broad.', 'He would have used his arms and his hands to push himself up; it turned out to be too hard to move;\nit wen t so slowly; and finally, almost in a frenzy, when he\ncarelessly shoved himself for wards with all the force he could\ngather, he chose the wrong direction, hit hard ag ainst the lower\nbedpost, and learned from the burning pain he felt that the lower\n part of his body might well, at present, be the most sensitive.', 'So then he tried to get the top part of his body out of the bed\nfirst, carefully turning his head to the side.', 'This he managed\nquite easily, and despite its breadth and its weight, the bulk of\nhis body eventually followed slowly in the direction of the head.', 'Bu t when he had at last got his head out of the bed and into the\nfresh air it occurre d to him that if he let himself fall it would be\na miracle if his head were not inj ured, so he became afraid to carry\non pushing himself forward the same way.', 'And he could not knock\nhimself out now at any price; the y would\nonly have to push their arms under the dome of his back, peel him\naway fro m the bed, bend down with the load and then be patient and\ncareful as he swang over onto the floor, where, hopefully, the \nlittle legs would find a use.', 'Should he re ally call for help\nthough, even apart from the fact that all the doors were locke d?', 'Despite all the difficulty he was in, he could not suppress a smile\nat this t hought.', 'After a while he had already moved so far across that it would have\nbeen hard for him to keep his balance if he rocked too hard.', 'The\ntime was now ten pas t seven and he would have to make a final\ndecision very soon.', 'Then there was a r ing at the door of the flat.', '"That\'ll be someone from work", he said to himself,

and froze very\nstill, although his little legs only became all the more lively as\n they danced around.', 'For a moment everything remained quiet.', '"They\'re not open ing the door", Gregor said to himself, caught in\nsome nonsensical hope.', "But then of course, the maid's firm steps\nwent to the door as ever and opened it.", "Gregor only needed to hear\nthe visitor's first words of greeting and he knew who it was the\nchief clerk himself.", 'Why did Gregor have to be the only one\ncondemned to wo rk for a company where they immediately became highly\nsuspicious at the slightest s hortcoming?', "Were all employees, every\none of them, louts, was there not one of t hem who was faithful and\ndevoted who would go so mad with pangs of conscience that he\ncouldn't get out of bed if he didn't spend at least a couple of\nhours in the mo rning on company business?", 'Was it really not enough\nto let one of the trainees m ake enquiries - assuming enquiries were\neven necessary - did the chief clerk have t o come himself, and did\nthey have to show the whole, innocent family that this was so\nsuspicious that only the chief clerk could be trusted to have the\nwisdom to inv estigate it?', 'And more because these thoughts had made\nhim upset than through any proper decision, he swang himself with\nall his force out of the bed.', "There was a loud thump, but it wasn't\nreally a loud noise.", "His fall was softened a little by the carpet,\nand Gregor's back was also more elastic than he had thought, which\nmad e the sound muffled and not too noticeable.", 'He had not held his\nhead carefully e nough, though, and hit it as he fell; he's been in town for a week now but\nstayed home every evening.", 'He sits with us in the kitchen and just \nreads the paper or studies train timetables.', 'His idea of relaxation\nis working with his fretsaw.', "He's made a little frame, for\ninstance, it only took him two o r three evenings, you'll be amazed\nhow nice it is; it's hanging up in his room; yo u'll see it as soon\nas Gregor opens the door.", 'Anyway, I\'m glad you\'re here; we wouldn\'t\nhave been able to get Gregor to open the door by ourselves; he\'s so\nstu bborn; and I\'m sure he isn\'t well, he said this morning that he\nis, but he isn ''t."', '"I''ll be there in a moment", said Gregor slowly'nand thoughtfully, but wit hout moving so that he would not miss any\nword of the conversation.', '"Well I can \'t think of any other way of\nexplaining it, Mrs. Samsa", said the chief clerk, "I hope it\'s\nnothing serious.', 'But on the other hand, I must say that if we\npeople in commerce ever become slightly unwell then, fortunately or\nunfortunately as you l ike, we simply have to overcome it because of\nbusiness considerations."', '"Can the chief clerk come in to see you\nnow then?', '", asked his father impatiently, knocki ng at the door\nagain.', '"No", said Gregor.', 'In the room on his right there follo wed\na painful silence; against the\ndoor and he would pull it up again with a start, as even the\nslightest noise he caused would be heard next door and th ey would\nall go silent.', '"What\'s that he\'s doing now", his father would say\naf ter a while, clearly having gone over to the door, and only then\nwould the interrup ted conversation slowly be taken up again.', "When explaining things, his father rep eated himself several times,\npartly because it was a long time since he had been oc cupied with\nthese matters himself and partly because Gregor's mother did not\nunder stand everything the first time.", 'From these repeated explanations\nGregor learne d, to his pleasure, that despite all their misfortunes\nthere was still some money a vailable from the old days.', 'It was not\na lot, but it had not been touched in the meantime and some interest\nhad accumulated.', 'Besides that, they had not been usin g up all the\nmoney that Gregor had been bringing home every month, keeping only a\n little for himself, so that that, too, had been accumulating.', 'Behind the door, Gr egor nodded with enthusiasm in his pleasure at\nthis unexpected thrift and cautio n.', "He could actually have used\nthis surplus money to reduce his father's debt to his boss, and the \nday when he could have freed himself from that job would have com e\nmuch closer, but now it was certainly better the way his father had\ndone thing s.", 'This money, however, was certainly not enough to enable the family\nto live of f the interest; it was enough to maintain them for,\nperhaps, one or two years, no m ore.', "That's to say, it was money\nthat should not really be touched but set aside

for emergencies; \nmoney to live on had to be earned.", 'His father was healthy but o ld,\nand lacking in self confidence.', 'During the five years that he had\nnot been working - the first holiday in a life that had been full of\nstrain and no success he had put on a lot of weight and become\nvery slow and clumsy.', "Would Gregor's el derly mother now have to go\nand earn money?", 'She suffered from asthma and it was a strain for her\njust to move about the home, every other day would be spent\nstrug gling for breath on the sofa by the open window.', 'Would his\nsister have to go and earn money?', 'She was still a child of\nseventeen, her life up till then had been v ery enviable, consisting\nof wearing nice clothes, sleeping late, helping out in the business, \njoining in with a few modest pleasures and most of all playing the \nvioli n.', 'Whenever they began to talk of the need to earn money,\nGregor would always fi rst let go of the door and then throw himself\nonto the cool, leather sofa next to i t, as he became quite hot with\nshame and regret.', 'He would often lie there the wh ole night through, not sleeping a\nwink but scratching at the leather for hours on e nd.', 'Or he might go\nto all the effort of pushing a chair to the window, climbing up onto\nthe sill and, propped up in the chair, leaning on the window to\nstare out of it.', 'He had used to feel a great sense of freedom from\ndoing this, but doing i t now was obviously something more remembered\nthan experienced, as what he actuall y saw in this way was becoming\nless distinct every day, even things that were quite near; he had\nused to curse the ever-present view of the hospital across the\nstree t, but now he could not see it at all, and if he had not known\nthat he lived in Cha rlottenstrasse, which was a quiet street despite\nbeing in the middle of the city, h e could have thought that he was\nlooking out the window at a barren waste where the grey sky and the\ngrey earth mingled inseparably.', 'His observant sister only neede d to\nnotice the chair twice before she would always push it back to its\nexact posi tion by the window after she had tidied up the room, and\neven left the inner pane o f the window open from then on.', 'If Gregor had only been able to speak to his sist er and thank her\nfor all that she had to do for him it would have been easier for h im\nto bear it; but as it was it caused him pain.', 'His sister,\nnaturally, tried a s far as possible to pretend there was nothing\nburdensome about it, and the longer it went on, of course, the \nbetter she was able to do so, but as time went by Gregor was also\nable to see through it all so much better.', 'It had even become very\nunp leasant for him, now, whenever she entered the room.', "No sooner\nhad she come in t han she would quickly close the door as a\nprecaution so that no-one would have to s uffer the view into\nGregor's room, then she would go straight to the window and pul l it\nhurriedly open almost as if she were suffocating.", 'Even if it was\ncold, she would stay at the window breathing deeply for a little\nwhile.', 'She would alarm Gr egor twice a day with this running about\nand noise making; he would stay under the couch shivering the whole\nwhile, knowing full well that she would certainly have li ked to\nspare him this ordeal, but it was impossible for her to be in the\nsame room with him with the windows closed.', "One day, about a month after Gregor's transform ation when his sister\nno longer had any particular reason to be shocked at his appe arance,\nshe came into the room a little earlier than usual and found him\nstill sta ring out the window, motionless, and just where he would be\nmost horrible.", "In it self, his sister's not coming into the room\nwould have been no surprise for Gregor as it would have been\ndifficult for her to immediately open the window while he was still\nthere, but not only did she not come in, she went straight back and\nclosed t he door behind her, a stranger would have thought he had\nthreatened her and tried t o bite her.", 'Gregor went straight to hide\nhimself under the couch, of course, but he had to wait until midday\nbefore his sister came back and she seemed much more un easy than\nusual.', 'It made him realise that she still found his appearance\nunbear able and would continue to do so, she probably even had to\novercome the urge to fle e when she saw the little bit of him that\nprotruded from under the couch.', 'One da y, in order to spare her even\nthis sight, he spent four hours carrying the bedsheet over to the \ncouch on his back and arranged it so that he was completely covered \nan d his sister would not be able to see him even if she bent down.', 'If she did not t hink this sheet was necessary then all she had to do\nwas take it off again, as it w as clear enough that it was no\npleasure for Gregor to cut himself off so completel y.', 'She left the\nsheet where it was.', 'Gregor even thought he glimpsed a look of \ngratitude one time when he carefully looked out from under the sheet\nto see how h is sister liked the new arrangement.', "For the first fourteen days, Gregor's parent s could not bring\nthemselves to come into the room to see him.", 'He would often he ar\nthem say how they appreciated all the new work his sister was doing\neven thoug h, before, they had seen her as a girl who was somewhat\nuseless and frequently been

annoyed with her.', "But now the two of\nthem, father and mother, would often both w ait outside the door of\nGregor's room while his sister tidied up in there, and as s oon as\nshe went out again she would have to tell them exactly how\neverything looke d, what Gregor had eaten, how he had behaved this\ntime and whether, perhaps, any sl ight improvement could be seen.", 'His mother also wanted to go in and visit Gregor relatively soon but\nhis father and sister at first persuaded her against it.', 'Gre gor\nlistened very closely to all this, and approved fully.', 'Later,\nthough, she h ad to be held back by force, which made her call out:\n"Let me go and see Gregor, he is my unfortunate son!', "Can't you\nunderstand I have to see him?", '", and Gregor would think to himself\nthat maybe it would be better if his mother came in, not eve ry day\nof course, but one day a week, perhaps; she could understand\neverything muc h better than his sister who, for all her courage, was\nstill just a child after al l, and really might not have had an\nadult\'s appreciation of the burdensome job she had taken on.', "Gregor's wish to see his mother was soon realised.", 'Out of\nconsi deration for his parents, Gregor wanted to avoid being seen at\nthe window during th e day, the few square meters of the floor did\nnot give him much room to crawl abou t, it was hard to just lie\nquietly through the night, his food soon stopped giving him any\npleasure at all, and so, to entertain himself, he got into the habit\nof cr awling up and down the walls and ceiling.', 'He was especially\nfond of hanging from the ceiling; it was quite different from lying\non the floor; he could breathe more freely; his body had a light\nswing to it; and up there, relaxed and almost happy, i t might happen\nthat he would surprise even himself by letting go of the ceiling and \nlanding on the floor with a crash.', 'But now, of course, he had far\nbetter contr ol of his body than before and, even with a fall as\ngreat as that, caused himself n o damage.', "Very soon his sister\nnoticed Gregor's new way of entertaining himself - he had, after\nall, left traces of the adhesive from his feet as he crawled about -\nand got it into her head to make it as easy as possible for him by\nremoving the furniture that got in his way, especially the chest of\ndrawers and the desk.", "No w, this was not something that she would be\nable to do by herself; she did not dare to ask for help from her\nfather; the sixteen year old maid had carried on bravely s ince the\ncook had left but she certainly would not have helped in this, she\nhad ev en asked to be allowed to keep the kitchen locked at all times\nand never to have to open the door unless it was especially\nimportant; so his sister had no choice but t o choose some time when\nGregor's father was not there and fetch his mother to help her.", 'As\nshe approached the room, Gregor could hear his mother express her\njoy, but once at the door she went silent.', 'First, of course, his\nsister came in and l ooked round to see that everything in the room\nwas alright; and only then did she l et her mother enter.', 'Gregor had\nhurriedly pulled the sheet down lower over the c ouch and put more\nfolds into it so that everything really looked as if it had just \nbeen thrown down by chance.', 'Gregor also refrained, this time, from\nspying out from under the sheet; he gave up the chance to see his\nmother until later and was s imply glad that she had come.', '"You can\ncome in, he can\'t be seen", said his sis ter, obviously leading her\nin by the hand.', "The old chest of drawers was too heav y for a pair\nof feeble women to be heaving about, but Gregor listened as they\npush ed it from its place, his sister always taking on the heaviest\npart of the work for herself and ignoring her mother's warnings that\nshe would strain herself.", 'This l asted a very long time.', "After\nlabouring at it for fifteen minutes or more his mo ther said it would\nbe better to leave the chest where it was, for one thing it was too\nheavy for them to get the job finished before Gregor's father got\nhome and lea ving it in the middle of the room it would be in his way\neven more, and for another thing it wasn't even sure that taking the\nfurniture away would really be any help t o him.", "She thought just\nthe opposite; the sight of the bare walls saddened her r ight to her\nheart; and why wouldn't Gregor feel the same way about it, he'd been\nu sed to this furniture in his room for a long time and it would make\nhim feel abando ned to be in an empty room like that.", 'Then, quietly,\nalmost whispering as if wan ting Gregor (whose whereabouts she did\nnot know) to hear not even the tone of her v oice, as she was\nconvinced that he did not understand her words, she added "and by \ntaking the furniture away, won\'t it seem like we\'re showing that\nwe\'ve given u p all hope of improvement and we\'re abandoning him to\ncope for himself?', 'I think it\'d be best to leave the room exactly the\nway it was before so that when Gregor c omes back to us again he\'ll\nfind everything unchanged and he\'ll be able to forget the time in\nbetween all the easier".', 'Hearing these words from his mother made Gr egor realise that the \nlack of any direct human communication, along with the monoto nous\nlife led by the family during these two months, must have made him\nconfused -

he could think of no other way of explaining to himself\nwhy he had seriously wanted his room emptied out.', 'Had he really\nwanted to transform his room into a cave, a warm room fitted out\nwith the nice furniture he had inherited?', 'That would have 1 et him\ncrawl around unimpeded in any direction, but it would also have let\nhim qui ckly forget his past when he had still been human.', 'He had\ncome very close to for getting, and it had only been the voice of his\nmother, unheard for so long, that ha d shaken him out of it.', 'Nothing\nshould be removed; everything had to stay; he co uld not do without\nthe good influence the furniture had on his condition; and if th e\nfurniture made it difficult for him to crawl about mindlessly that\nwas not a los s but a great advantage.', "His sister, unfortunately, did not agree; she had become used to the \nidea, not without reason, that she was Gregor's spokesman to his \nparen ts about the things that concerned him.", "This meant that his\nmother's advice now was sufficient reason for her to insist on\nremoving not only the chest of drawers a nd the desk, as she had\nthought at first, but all the furniture apart from the allimportant\ncouch.", 'It was more than childish perversity, of course, or the\nunexpe cted confidence she had recently acquired, that made her\ninsist; she had indeed not iced that Gregor needed a lot of room to\ncrawl about in, whereas the furniture, as far as anyone could see,\nwas of no use to him at all.', 'Girls of that age, though, do become\nenthusiastic about things and feel they must get their way whenever\nthey can.', "Perhaps this was what tempted Grete to make Gregor's\nsituation seem even mo re shocking than it was so that she could do\neven more for him.", 'Grete would prob ably be the only one who would\ndare enter a room dominated by Gregor crawling about the bare walls\nby himself.', 'So she refused to let her mother dissuade her.', "Gre gor's mother\nalready looked uneasy in his room, she soon stopped speaking and\nhelp ed Gregor's sister to get the chest of drawers out with what\nstrength she had.", 'T he chest of drawers was something that Gregor\ncould do without if he had to, but th e writing desk had to stay.', 'Hardly had the two women pushed the chest of drawers, groaning, out\nof the room than Gregor poked his head out from under the couch to\ns ee what he could do about it.', 'He meant to be as careful and\nconsiderate as he co uld, but, unfortunately, it was his mother who\ncame back first while Grete in the n ext room had her arms round the\nchest, pushing and pulling at it from side to side by herself\nwithout, of course, moving it an inch.', 'His mother was not used to\nth e sight of Gregor, he might have made her ill, so Gregor hurried\nbackwards to the f ar end of the couch.', 'In his startlement, though,\nhe was not able to prevent the sheet at its front from moving a\nlittle.', "It was enough to attract his mother's a ttention.", 'She stood\nvery still, remained there a moment, and then went back out to\nGrete.', 'Gregor kept trying to assure himself that nothing unusual was\nhappeni ng, it was just a few pieces of furniture being moved after\nall, but he soon had to admit that the women going to and fro, their\nlittle calls to each other, the scrapi ng of the furniture on the\nfloor, all these things made him feel as if he were bein g assailed\nfrom all sides.', 'With his head and legs pulled in against him and\nhis body pressed to the floor, he was forced to admit to himself\nthat he could not stan d all of this much longer.', "They were emptying\nhis room out; taking away everythi ng that was dear to him; they had\nalready taken out the chest containing his fretsa w and other tools;\nnow they threatened to remove the writing desk with its place\nc learly worn into the floor, the desk where he had done his homework\nas a business t rainee, at high school, even while he had been at\ninfant school--he really could no t wait any longer to see whether\nthe two women's intentions were good.", 'He had ne arly forgotten they\nwere there anyway, as they were now too tired to say anything w hile\nthey worked and he could only hear their feet as they stepped\nheavily on the floor.', 'So, while the women were leant against the desk in the other room\ncatchin g their breath, he sallied out, changed direction four times\nnot knowing what he sh ould save first before his attention was\nsuddenly caught by the picture on the wall - which was already\ndenuded of everything else that had been on it - of the lady dr essed\nin copious fur.', 'He hurried up onto the picture and pressed himself\nagains t its glass, it held him firmly and felt good on his hot\nbelly.', 'This picture at least, now totally covered by Gregor, would\ncertainly be taken away by no-one.', 'H e turned his head to face the\ndoor into the living room so that he could watch the women when they\ncame back.', 'They had not allowed themselves a long rest and came back quite\nsoon; Grete had put her arm around her mother and was nearly\ncarrying h er.', '"What shall we take now, then?', '", said Grete and\nlooked around.', 'Her ey es met those of Gregor on the wall.', 'Perhaps\nonly because her mother was there, s he remained calm, bent her face\nto her so that she would not look round and said, a lbeit hurriedly\nand with a tremor in her voice: "Come on, let\'s go back in the\nli

ving room for a while?"', 'Gregor could see what Grete had in mind,\nshe wanted to t ake her mother somewhere safe and then chase him down\nfrom the wall.', 'Well, she c ould certainly try it!', 'He sat unyielding\non his picture.', "He would rather jump at Grete's face.", 'But Grete\'s words had made her mother quite worried, she steppe d to\none side, saw the enormous brown patch against the flowers of the\nwallpaper, and before she even realised it was Gregor that she saw\nscreamed: "Oh God, oh Go d!"', 'Arms outstretched, she fell onto the\ncouch as if she had given up everything and stayed there immobile.', '"Gregor!"', 'shouted his sister, glowering at him and shaking her fist.', 'That was the first word she had spoken to him directly since hi s\ntransformation.', "She ran into the other room to fetch some kind of\nsmelling sa Its to bring her mother out of her faint; Gregor wanted\nto help too - he could save his picture later, although he stuck\nfast to the glass and had to pull himself off by force; then he,\ntoo, ran into the next room as if he could advise his sister lik e in\nthe old days; but he had to just stand behind her doing nothing; she\nwas look ing into various bottles, he startled her when she turned\nround; a bottle fell to t he ground and broke; a splinter cut\nGregor's face, some kind of caustic medicine sp lashed all over him;\nnow, without delaying any longer, Grete took hold of all the b ottles\nshe could and ran with them in to her mother; she slammed the door\nshut wit h her foot.", 'So now Gregor was shut out from his mother,\nwho, because of him, mig ht be near to death; he could not open the\ndoor if he did not want to chase his sis ter away, and she had to\nstay with his mother; there was nothing for him to do but wait; and,\noppressed with anxiety and self-reproach, he began to crawl about,\nhe c rawled over everything, walls, furniture, ceiling, and finally\nin his confusion as the whole room began to spin around him he fell\ndown into the middle of the dinner table.', 'He lay there for a while, numb and immobile, all around him it was\nquiet, maybe that was a good sign.', 'Then there was someone at the\ndoor.', 'The maid, of course, had locked herself in her kitchen so\nthat Grete would have to go and answer it.', 'His father had arrived\nhome.', '"What\'s happened?"', "were his first words; , 'She answered him with Grete's appearance\nmust have made everything clear to him.", \nsubdued voice, and openly pressed her face into his chest: "Mother\'s\nfainted, bu t she\'s better now.', 'Gregor got out."', '"Just as I\nexpected", said his father, "just as I always said, but you women\nwouldn\'t listen, would you."', 'It was clear to Gregor that Grete had\nnot said enough and that his father took it to mean that s omething\nbad had happened, that he was responsible for some act of violence.', 'Tha t meant Gregor would now have to try to calm his father, as he\ndid not have the tim e to explain things to him even if that had been\npossible.', 'So he fled to the doo r of his room and pressed himself\nagainst it so that his father, when he came in fr om the hall, could\nsee straight away that Gregor had the best intentions and would go\nback into his room without delay, that it would not be necessary to\ndrive him b ack but that they had only to open the door and he would\ndisappear.', 'His father, though, was not in the mood to notice subtleties like\nthat; "Ah!', '", he shouted a s he came in, sounding as if he were both\nangry and glad at the same time.', 'Grego r drew his head back from the \ndoor and lifted it towards his father.', 'He really h ad not imagined\nhis father the way he stood there now; of late, with his new habit \nof crawling about, he had neglected to pay attention to what was\ngoing on the res t of the flat the way he had done before.', 'He really\nought to have expected thing s to have changed, but still, still, was\nthat really his father?', 'The same tired man as used to be laying\nthere entombed in his bed when Gregor came back from his b usiness\ntrips, who would receive him sitting in the armchair in his\nnightgown when he came back in the evenings; who was hardly even\nable to stand up but, as a sign o f his pleasure, would just raise\nhis arms and who, on the couple of times a year wh en they went for a\nwalk together on a Sunday or public holiday wrapped up tightly i n\nhis overcoat between Gregor and his mother, would always labour his\nway forward a little more slowly than them, who were already walking\nslowly for his sake; who w ould place his stick down carefully and,\nif he wanted to say something would invari ably stop and gather his\ncompanions around him.', 'He was standing up straight enou gh now;\ndressed in a smart blue uniform with gold buttons, the sort worn by\nthe em ployees at the banking institute; above the high, stiff collar\nof the coat his stro ng double-chin emerged; under the bushy\neyebrows, his piercing, dark eyes looked ou t fresh and alert; his\nnormally unkempt white hair was combed down painfully close to his\nscalp.', 'He took his cap, with its gold monogram from, probably, some\nban k, and threw it in an arc right across the room onto the sofa,\nput his hands in his trouser pockets, pushing back the bottom of his\nlong uniform coat, and, with look o f determination, walked towards\nGregor.', 'He probably did not even know himself wh

at he had in mind,\nbut nonetheless lifted his feet unusually high.', 'Gregor was am azed\nat the enormous size of the soles of his boots, but wasted no time\nwith that - he knew full well, right from the first day of his new\nlife, that his father thou ght it necessary to always be extremely\nstrict with him.', 'And so he ran up to his father, stopped when his\nfather stopped, scurried forwards again when he moved, eve n\nslightly.', 'In this way they went round the room several times\nwithout anything decisive happening, without even giving the \nimpression of a chase as everything wen t so slowly.', 'Gregor remained\nall this time on the floor, largely because he fear ed his father\nmight see it as especially provoking if he fled onto the wall or\ncei ling.', 'Whatever he did, Gregor had to admit that he certainly\nwould not be able t o keep up this running about for long, as for\neach step his father took he had to c arry out countless movements.', 'He became noticeably short of breath, even in his e arlier life his\nlungs had not been very reliable.', 'Now, as he lurched about in hi s\nefforts to muster all the strength he could for running he could\nhardly keep his eyes open; his thoughts became too slow for him to\nthink of any other way of saving himself than running; he almost\nforgot that the walls were there for him to use alt hough, here, they\nwere concealed behind carefully carved furniture full of notches and\nprotrusions - then, right beside him, lightly tossed, something flew\ndown and rolled in front of him.', 'It was an apple; then another one\nimmediately flew at hi m; Gregor froze in shock; there was no longer\nany point in running as his father ha d decided to bombard him.', 'He\nhad filled his pockets with fruit from the bowl on the sideboard and\nnow, without even taking the time for careful aim, threw one appl e\nafter another.', 'These little, red apples rolled about on the floor,\nknocking i nto each other as if they had electric motors.', "An apple\nthrown without much forc e glanced against Gregor's back and slid off\nwithout doing any harm.", 'Another one however, immediately following\nit, hit squarely and lodged in his back; Gregor want ed to drag\nhimself away, as if he could remove the surprising, the incredible\npain by changing his position; but he felt as if nailed to the spot\nand spread himself o ut, all his senses in confusion.', "The last thing\nhe saw was the door of his room being pulled open, his sister was\nscreaming, his mother ran out in front of her in her blouse (as his\nsister had taken off some of her clothes after she had fainted t o\nmake it easier for her to breathe), she ran to his father, her\nskirts unfastened and sliding one after another to the ground,\nstumbling over the skirts she pushed h erself to his father, her arms\naround him, uniting herself with him totally - now G regor lost his\nability to see anything - her hands behind his father's head begging \nhim to spare Gregor's life.", "III\n\n\nNo-one dared to remove the apple lodged in Gregor's flesh, so it\nremained there as a visible reminder of his injury.", 'He had suffered\nit there for more than a month, and his condition seemed serious\nenough t o remind even his father that Gregor, despite his current\nsad and revolting form, w as a family member who could not be treated\nas an enemy.', 'On the contrary, as a f amily there was a duty to\nswallow any revulsion for him and to be patient, just to be patient.', 'Because of his injuries, Gregor had lost much of his mobility -\nprob ably permanently.', 'He had been reduced to the condition of an\nancient invalid and it took him long, long minutes to crawl across\nhis room - crawling over the ceiling was out of the question - but\nthis deterioration in his condition was fully (in his opinion) made\nup for by the door to the living room being left open every evenin g.', "He got into the habit of closely watching it for one or two hours\nbefore it w as opened and then, lying in the darkness of his room\nwhere he could not be seen fr om the living room, he could watch the\nfamily in the light of the dinner table and listen to their\nconversation - with everyone's permission, in a way, and thus quite \ndifferently from before.", 'They no longer held the lively conversations of earlie r times, of\ncourse, the ones that Gregor always thought about with longing when\nhe was tired and getting into the damp bed in some small hotel room.', 'All of them wer e usually very quiet nowadays.', 'Soon after dinner,\nhis father would go to sleep i n his chair; his mother and sister\nwould urge each other to be quiet; his mother, b ent deeply under the \nlamp, would sew fancy underwear for a fashion shop; his siste r, who\nhad taken a sales job, learned shorthand and French in the evenings\nso that she might be able to get a better position later on.', 'Sometimes his father would w ake up and say to Gregor\'s mother\n"you\'re doing so much sewing again today!', '", as if he did not know\nthat he had been dozing - and then he would go back to sleep again\nwhile mother and sister would exchange a tired grin.', "With a kind of stubbo rnness, Gregor's father refused to take his\nuniform off even at home; while his nig htgown hung unused on its peg\nGregor's father would slumber where he was, fully dre ssed, as if\nalways ready to serve and expecting to hear the voice of his\nsuperior

even here.", "The uniform had not been new to start with, but\nas a result of this i t slowly became even shabbier despite the\nefforts of Gregor's mother and sister to look after it.", 'Gregor\nwould often spend the whole evening looking at all the sta ins on\nthis coat, with its gold buttons always kept polished and shiny,\nwhile the old man in it would sleep, highly uncomfortable but\npeaceful.', "As soon as it stru ck ten, Gregor's mother would speak gently to his\nfather to wake him and try to per suade him to go to bed, as he\ncouldn't sleep properly where he was and he really ha d to get his\nsleep if he was to be up at six to get to work.", 'But since he had\nb een in work he had become more obstinate and would always insist on\nstaying longer at the table, even though he regularly fell asleep\nand it was then harder than ever to persuade him to exchange the \nchair for his bed.', 'Then, however much mother and sister would\nimportune him with little reproaches and warnings he would keep\nslowl y shaking his head for a quarter of an hour with his eyes\nclosed and refusing to ge t up.', "Gregor's mother would tug at his\nsleeve, whisper endearments into his ear, Gregor's sister would\nleave her work to help her mother, but nothing would have any effect\non him.", 'He would just sink deeper into his chair.', 'Only when the\ntwo w omen took him under the arms he would abruptly open his eyes,\nlook at them one afte r the other and say: "What a life!', 'This is what\npeace I get in my old age!"', "A nd supported by the two women he would\nlift himself up carefully as if he were carr ying the greatest load\nhimself, let the women take him to the door, send them off a nd carry\non by himself while Gregor's mother would throw down her needle and\nhis s ister her pen so that they could run after his father and\ncontinue being of help to him.", 'Who, in this tired and overworked family, would have had time to\ngive more attention to Gregor than was absolutely necessary?', "The\nhousehold budget became e ven smaller; so now the maid was dismissed;\nan enormous, thick-boned charwoman with white hair that flapped\naround her head came every morning and evening to do the he aviest\nwork; everything else was looked after by Gregor's mother on top of\nthe lar ge amount of sewing work she did.", 'Gregor even learned,\nlistening to the evening conversation about what price they had\nhoped for, that several items of jewellery b elonging to the family\nhad been sold, even though both mother and sister had been v ery fond\nof wearing them at functions and celebrations.', 'But the loudest\ncomplai nt was that although the flat was much too big for their\npresent circumstances, the y could not move out of it, there was no\nimaginable way of transferring Gregor to t he new address.', 'He could\nsee quite well, though, that there were more reasons th an\nconsideration for him that made it difficult for them to move, it\nwould have be en quite easy to transport him in any suitable crate\nwith a few air holes in it; th e main thing holding the family back\nfrom their decision to move was much more to d o with their total\ndespair, and the thought that they had been struck with a misfor tune\nunlike anything experienced by anyone else they knew or were related\nto.', "T hey carried out absolutely everything that the world expects\nfrom poor people, Greg or's father brought bank employees their\nbreakfast, his mother sacrificed herself b y washing clothes for\nstrangers, his sister ran back and forth behind her desk at t he\nbehest of the customers, but they just did not have the strength to\ndo any mor e.", "And the injury in Gregor's back began to hurt as much\nas when it was new.", 'After they had come back from taking his father\nto bed Gregor\'s mother and sister would now leave their work where\nit was and sit close together, cheek to cheek; his mother would\npoint to Gregor\'s room and say "Close that door, Grete", and then,\nw hen he was in the dark again, they would sit in the next room and\ntheir tears would mingle, or they would simply sit there staring\ndry-eyed at the table.', 'Gregor har dly slept at all, either night or day.', "Sometimes he would\nthink of taking over t he family's affairs, just like before, the\nnext time the door was opened; he had lo ng forgotten about his boss\nand the chief clerk, but they would appear again in his thoughts,\nthe salesmen and the apprentices, that stupid teaboy, two or three\nfrien ds from other businesses, one of the chambermaids from a\nprovincial hotel, a tender memory that appeared and disappeared\nagain, a cashier from a hat shop for whom his attention had been\nserious but too slow, - all of them appeared to him, mixed toget her\nwith strangers and others he had forgotten, but instead of helping\nhim and his family they were all of them inaccessible, and he was\nglad when they disappeared.", 'Other times he was not at all in the\nmood to look after his family, he was filled with simple rage about\nthe lack of attention he was shown, and although he could th ink of\nnothing he would have wanted, he made plans of how he could get into\nthe pa ntry where he could take all the things he was entitled to,\neven if he was not hung ry.', "Gregor's sister no longer thought about\nhow she could please him but would h urriedly push some food or other\ninto his room with her foot before she rushed out

to work in the\nmorning and at midday, and in the evening she would sweep it away\na gain with the broom, indifferent as to whether it had been eaten or\n- more often th an not - had been left totally untouched.", 'She still\ncleared up the room in the e vening, but now she could not have been\nany quicker about it.', 'Smears of dirt wer e left on the walls, here\nand there were little balls of dust and filth.', 'At firs t, Gregor\nwent into one of the worst of these places when his sister arrived\nas a reproach to her, but he could have stayed there for weeks\nwithout his sister doing anything about it; she could see the dirt\nas well as he could but she had simply de cided to leave him to it.', "At the same time she became touchy in a way that was qu ite new for\nher and which everyone in the family understood - cleaning up\nGregor's room was for her and her alone.", "Gregor's mother did once\nthoroughly clean his ro om, and needed to use several bucketfuls of\nwater to do it - although that much dam pness also made Gregor ill\nand he lay flat on the couch, bitter and immobile.", "Bu t his mother\nwas to be punished still more for what she had done, as hardly had\nhi s sister arrived home in the evening than she noticed the change\nin Gregor's room a nd, highly aggrieved, ran back into the living\nroom where, despite her mothers rais  $\hbox{\it ed and imploring hands, she} \verb|\nbroke into convulsive tears.", "Her father, of course,$ was startled\nout of his chair and the two parents looked on astonished and\nhelples s; then they, too, became agitated; Gregor's father, standing\nto the right of his m other, accused her of not leaving the cleaning\nof Gregor's room to his sister; from her left, Gregor's sister\nscreamed at her that she was never to clean Gregor's room again; \nwhile his mother tried to draw his father, who was beside himself \nwith ange r, into the bedroom; his sister, quaking with tears,\nthumped on the table with her small fists; and Gregor hissed in\nanger that no-one had even thought of closing the door to save him\nthe sight of this and all its noise.", "Gregor's sister was exhaus ted from going out to work, and looking\nafter Gregor as she had done before was eve n more work for her, but\neven so his mother ought certainly not to have taken her p lace.", 'Gregor, on the other hand, ought not to be neglected.', 'Now, though,\nthe charwoman was here.', "This elderly widow, with a robust bone\nstructure that made h er able to withstand the hardest of things in\nher long life, wasn't really repelled by Gregor.", "Just by chance one\nday, rather than any real curiosity, she opened th e door to Gregor's\nroom and found herself face to face with him.", 'He was taken to tally\nby surprise, no-one was chasing him but he began to rush to and fro\nwhile sh e just stood there in amazement with her hands crossed in\nfront of her.', 'From the n on she never failed to open the door\nslightly every evening and morning and look briefly in on him.', 'At\nfirst she would call to him as she did so with words that she\nprobably considered friendly, such as "come on then, you old\ndung-beetle!', '", or "look at the old dung-beetle there!"', 'Gregor never\nresponded to being spok en to in that way, but just remained where he\nwas without moving as if the door had never even been opened.', 'If\nonly they had told this charwoman to clean up his roo m every day\ninstead of letting her disturb him for no reason whenever she felt\nlik e it!', 'One day, early in the morning while a heavy rain struck the\nwindowpanes, p erhaps indicating that spring was coming, she began to\nspeak to him in that way onc e again.', 'Gregor was so resentful of it\nthat he started to move toward her, he wa s slow and infirm, but it\nwas like a kind of attack.', "Instead of being afraid, th e charwoman\njust lifted up one of the chairs from near the door and stood there\nwi th her mouth open, clearly intending not to close her mouth until\nthe chair in her hand had been slammed down into Gregor's back.", '"Aren\'t you coming any closer, th en?', '", she asked when Gregor turned\nround again, and she calmly put the chair ba ck in the corner.', 'Gregor had almost entirely stopped eating.', 'Only if he happen ed to\nfind himself next to the food that had been prepared for him he\nmight take s ome of it into his mouth to play with it, leave it there\na few hours and then, more often than not, spit it out again.', 'At\nfirst he thought it was distress at the st ate of his room that\nstopped him eating, but he had soon got used to the changes ma de\nthere.', 'They had got into the habit of putting things into this room\nthat the y had no room for anywhere else, and there were now many\nsuch things as one of the rooms in the flat had been rented out to\nthree gentlemen.', "These earnest gentleme n - all three of them had\nfull beards, as Gregor learned peering through the crack in the door\none day - were painfully insistent on things' being tidy.", 'This\nmean t not only in their own room but, since they had taken a room in\nthis establishmen t, in the entire flat and especially in the\nkitchen.', 'Unnecessary clutter was som ething they could not tolerate,\nespecially if it was dirty.', 'They had moreover br ought most of their\nown furnishings and equipment with them.', 'For this reason, ma ny\nthings had become superfluous which, although they could not be\nsold, the famil


